Learning To Become A Multi-Colored Girl

A Call For All Young Women

A lot has happened since the books *Created To Be His Help Meet* and *Preparing To Be His Help Meet* were published. *Created* has been translated into eight or ten languages and there have been thousands of *Created* and *Preparing* classes all over the world. We have received many letters from ladies and girls sharing what they have learned. Our most active blog is **Preparingtobeahelpmeet.com** with girls and married ladies sharing what God has taught them. Through the letters and the blogs I have learned much that has helped me in addressing your needs. Here are a few examples.

Men were created in God's image. God breathed the breath of life straight into Adam. It is mind-boggling to think that mere man is in God's own image. In effect, man is in the likeness of God. God feels, he thinks, and he loves just as does his creation. Just as Eve was created to meet a need in Adam, so we meet a need in God. That is strange to me. We all know that God is three persons, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. We learned in *Created to Be His Help Meet* that as men were created in God's image, so each man predominantly expresses one of the three aspects of God's image.

As Adam was created in God's image, Eve was created in Adam's image. God could have shaped two clay figures and breathed life into both, but he chose to take the woman from the man's own flesh and bone. I have come to see that tiered process as very significant, making it consistent with nature that the woman should be the helper in the chain of command.

A woman's job is to mesh into her man whether he be red, yellow or blue.

God did not create women as he did men, strongly fixed in one type or another. Being created in the image of man, we are more muted and flexible in our types. If a woman were a strong Command type married to Mr. Steady, that would cause terrible conflict in the marital relationship.

If we were to attach colors to the three types, Command men would be red, the Steady man would be blue, and the Visionary would be yellow. Few men are a 100 percent pure type/color. Most men are one type with just a touch of another type to mellow him out. But this article is not about men, but rather about us girls and our adaptability of color.

The woman was called to be her man's helper, to fashion herself to be what he needs her to be. It is quite a calling. In order to do this a woman needs to be a kaleidoscope, a full array of color. One woman might be strong in red, but she also has all the other colors so that she can blend her life into that of her man. God provides us with all that we need to fulfill our calling. For example, at this time in my life as a Help Meet I am required to be a writer, office director, web planner, wife, grandmother and, last but certainly not least, a country woman. If I had to give myself a color or type at this time in my life it would be a bright orange: half red, half yellow. I have been put into a role that requires leadership and creativity. As I was growing up my color was blue (servant) so I have had to adapt quite a bit. If I had married a different man I would likely not be a writer, an office director, web planner or a country woman. How different my life would have been?

I might have married a factory worker who lived in the city. I could have lived my whole life in a rented apartment, worked as a domestic for extra income, and had just two children. I would have still loved the Lord because that is who I am, a lover of God. Most everything else in my life would have been different; what I learned, how I dressed, what I enjoyed, and where I went. I think that I would have grown potted plants full of herbs and salads on my balcony. My color would have been green, mostly blue but some yellow so that I might raise children strong in spirit.

It would have been easy for me to have married a committed Southern Baptist minister. My color would



have been purple, part blue to serve but part red to lead. It is a queenly color, as Baptists like their pastors' wives to have dignity. I would have worn simple conservative suits, stockings, and slight heels, kept my hair done prim and proper, and my nails clean and painted. I would have been a Sunday School teacher, planned Vacation Bible Schools, and promoted my husband in his calling. I would have been a lover of God, because I love him. But I would have been a different lady, certainly not the country woman I am today.

But then, I might have married an Amish type man, living plain, dressing plain, and speaking German. I would have never touched a computer, but spent my life having 12 children and working the land. You would never know me as me, but I would still be me, only I would be meshing into the man to whom I was a helper. I would still be a lover of God, because I love him, and in loving him I would have put forth an effort to honor God by honoring and reverencing my husband, as God has written in Ephesians 5:33

"... and the wife see that she reverence her husband." 1 Peter 3:1, *"Likewise, ye wives, be in subjection to your own husbands;"*

When a girl marries a man she becomes a new person. She becomes his bride, his woman, his helper. It is God's will that her life be fashioned to help him. If a girl comes into marriage knowing that she is equipped and appointed to be this one new person, then she can adapt and find fulfillment in her new self expression.

This past week the local *Preparing* class invited two older mothers to share their experiences in marriage. It was quite sobering, and some of the girls came away from class unnerved by the burdens of marriage. What the mothers wanted to convey to the girls was, "Learn now while you are young to honor your husbands. Learn patience to continue in your role as a Help Meet, and commit yourself to God now while you are young so you can avoid



some of our trials and errors as we struggle to find our way."

Today's culture, our own selfishness, and our lack of knowing God's Word all play a part in making marriages miserable. What you learn as a young unmarried woman can change your life more completely than you can imagine. If you are wise you will learn to become a many colored girl. Don't say to yourself, "I am a go-to girl and not a servant." Rather say, "I am learning to be anything I

need to be. I want to be a servant, I need to learn to lead and teach, and I will learn to be creative because my husband may need me to be all of these.” Practice being flexible in your likes and dislikes, how you feel about things, and what you hope to accomplish. Start striving to shape your life to help others, and hide God’s Words in your heart concerning becoming a wife. Lastly, make a written commitment to honor the man God provides

for you. Choose a life’s verse that you write down on the cover of your Bible, one that goes along with your commitment. All these things will shape you for your coming marriage, enabling you to avoid the many pitfalls that entangle so many. Making yourself ready for any eventuality in your future marriage demands much practice if you want a glorious marriage. ☼

The Good Salt

Why did God call his people “the salt of the earth” if salt is so unhealthy?”

Both of my parents had problems with salt. If they ate too much salt, they would swell and then their blood pressure would rise. “Salt is bad for you,” Mom would say as she shook her head in puzzlement, “but the Bible speaks so highly of salt. Why did God call his people “the salt of the earth” if salt is so unhealthy?”

Unfortunately, I inherited the salt problem. I was in my early 40s when I noticed my wedding ring was tight. Then I noticed my ankles seemed to stay fat. Next I noticed a great swelling in other places. I had always had very low blood pressure but with the swelling came a quick, dramatic change. My doctor said, “No more salt.” Food became very boring. I still ended up getting too much salt because some of my meals didn’t started in my own garden where I could control what went into

the food. I started eating lots of fresh celery because it acts as a diuretic, which provokes the body to flush fluids. It worked amazingly well, but keeping up the celery thing was not practical. I also started drinking Stinging Nettle tea, which also acts as a diuretic. But I sure missed salt.

Then a few years ago I started noticing dirty looking salt available on the shelves of some health markets. I began to read what researchers were discovering concerning processed salt and real salt. WOW! Salt is not always bad. Salt is good—at least, real salt is good.

Bad Salt

Refined salt is harvested from salt mines as brine, which means the salt is in water. Chemicals are added to the brine to remove the minerals. Ironically, in the salt industry min-

erals are referred to as impurities. The minerals (impurities) are sold to be used in other industries. Then the brine is evaporated using high compression and heat. This disrupts the molecular structure of the salt. Then toxic chemicals are added to prevent clotting. Iodine is also added (iodine is depleted from the soil and should be added to every diet). The purity of food-grade salt is between 99.7-99.95%. “Pure” means that the content of the salt is sodium (39%) and chloride (60%). And so, man has managed to render salt a lifeless product. Dead salt could be assured a longer shelf life, and without the minerals it is white and appears cleaner. The only problem is that the human body doesn’t respond well to an imbalance of sodium and chloride. Case in point: Me, along with a host of other people.

The human body requires lots of minerals, and those minerals need to be balanced. When there is an imbalance of minerals, the body starts to break down, causing the pH of the body to become unstable. The

immune system gets faulty, sleep patterns are disturbed, hormones go nutty, even your hair will be affected. Of course, the kidneys can’t function properly, which means swelling and high blood pressure. A balance of minerals is critical for good health. In much of the United States the minerals in the soil have become depleted; therefore, the foods grown in those soils lack the minerals required for good health. Many people suffer from lack of minerals.

God designed mankind to have a natural craving for salt. All natural salt is loaded with minerals in a balance that works well with the body. Colors (pink, dirty gray, etc.) document the presence of minerals in the salt. Salt comes from the earth. Like all earth (dirt, coal, clay, etc) the qualities of the salt vary depending where it is harvested. In my garden, the upper end is less fertile than the lower end because nutrients are prone to wash downhill. The same is true with natural salt. Some salt comes from areas of the world

where it is loaded with minerals, while other salt has a lower amount of minerals. Celtic Sea Salt has been tested to have a very high percentage of minerals. It comes from France and is harvested by channeling ocean water into clay-lined ponds. It is an ugly gray, large grain salt. If I were sick, this is the salt I would use in my food. In fact, I do keep this kind of salt on hand to use for slow-cooking items like beans, stews, etc. Redmond's Real Salt comes from the mines in Utah. It has a pinkish color and a slightly lower mineral content

than Celtic Salt, but still offers life-giving minerals. I also make sure I take iodine or kelp (seaweed high in iodine) every day.

All natural salt is loaded with minerals in a balance that works well with the body.

Switching to natural salt is an easy and smart thing to do. Keep your eye open for products that now use natural salt; it is a fast growing market.

Learn and live well. ☸





Making an Eternal Difference in the Prisons of California

West Coast Prison Distribution of *Good and Evil* books

Dear NGJ Readers,

Around one year ago, our charity group here in California, called Lamb Services, Inc., responded to an invitation in the NGJ magazine to send *Good and Evil* books to those incarcerated. This article said that if we launched this outreach program, we soon would be overwhelmed with requests of prisoners who wanted a copy of this book. We can now testify that they were right. In the last month, we have averaged around 45 letters each day asking for a book. Many of these letters contain admissions that they have made wrong choices and they want to go a different way, and could we please send them a copy of the *Good and Evil* book. Several

tell about their families and the pain of being separated from them. They sometimes ask for a book to be sent to their families. But now, with our funds being limited, we can only send them to those incarcerated.

I recently read a news article indicating that Islam was making inroads to those who are incarcerated, and many are open to its false teachings. What a shame that each inmate does not have a copy of *Good and Evil* as well as a Bible. What an opportunity we have to send the saving light of Jesus to those incarcerated!

Here a few comments from some of the letters we have received:

From William: *“It is amazing how such a book can make myself and my friends aware how powerful the beauty of the Bible can be. I am practically praying and begging the good people at Lamb Services to please send me this book through your great charity.”*

From Geoffrey: *“I just took a look at your comic type book Good and Evil and was blown away to say the least. I did not want to stop reading it. It was so easy to go from page to page. Unfortunately though, it was not mine to keep. I hate to say this, but it is hard for me to get a grasp of what is going on in my Bible. I would be forever grateful if I could receive a copy of*

Good and Evil and feel that it would help me to better understand God and Jesus Christ's message. Thank you for your time and God bless."

From Rubhen: *"I was wondering if you could send me a Good and Evil picture Bible on this walk. Also, I would like to take it home and share it with my wife and my two beautiful daughters. Also, could you please say a special prayer for my wife and daughters. It is really hard right now taking care of everything while I am incarcerated."*

From Israel: *"I am 19 years old, and I got sent to prison for mistakes I did when I was younger. I've been incarcerated since 2009, it broke my mothers heart to see her youngest son get 9 years with 2 strikes at 18. I learned the hard way, I guess, that hanging with the wrong crowd wasn't going to take me anywhere. My friend showed me a book called Good and Evil and it surprised me, it opened my eyes! I see that there is more to life than always getting into trouble. I never got to read the whole thing. I was wondering if you know how I could come across*

one? I really need God right now. I feel so lonely in this prison system."

In the past year we have sent out over 7,000 books to 69 different facilities here in California. We have also sent cases to Chaplains for them to distribute, but we have had to stop that since we cannot keep up with the individual requests we are now getting on a daily basis. It is amazing that the demand for this book is so strong and it keeps on coming.

We have several work teams consisting of grandparents, parents, teenagers and children who come together for one or two evenings each month to process these requests. We read the letters and sort them in tubs according to their request for an English book, Spanish book, thank you and prayer requests, or correspondence. We have several working to input the names into a computer program we designed to put all the required information on the label that the jails and prisons require. We have the children put the return sticky labels on the envelopes and perform other menial tasks. We

have some who will open each book and handwrite a short personal greeting, “Jesus loves you” and John 3:16 on the inside cover, and stamp with the information stating that this book was provided from us and our address. We also insert a loose one page note with several things on it, such as a reminder that we have prayed for them that they would believe on Jesus Christ and accept Him into their life, information on how to get a correspondence Bible Study, and on the back we have printed out the song “I was in Sin’s prison” which proclaims the victory we have since Jesus signed our pardon.

We usually have the entire group stop and pray for each prisoner that has requested a book, as well as their families and the other people that were possibly hurt by their crimes.

The evenings that our work teams get together flow smoothly and it is inspiring to see so many hands working to help get these books ready to mail out.

Due to the large amount of requests we are now getting, our biggest limitation is getting the funds to buy and mail out the books to keep up with the demand. We do truly want to say thank you for all that have prayed for us, and given of your funds and time to help us with this project.

May our Lord Jesus be Praised!



Luke 2:40 And the child grew, and waxed **strong in spirit**, filled with **wisdom**: and the **grace of God was upon him**.


Of Jesus, after his visit to the temple at 12 years of age, we read:



Excerpt from
**Training Children to be
Strong In Spirit**

By Michael Pearl

As my children were growing up, I was fully aware that the development of their spirits was my number one priority. My familiarity with the training of military men and women may have influenced my thinking. I knew that the goal of military boot camp is the development of the body, but even more so, its purpose is to strengthen the spirits of the men and women. Air Force, Soldiers, Sailors, and Marines must come to believe in their own abilities if they are to triumph in adversity. They must learn that pain is not a signal to quit, fear is not an occasion to retreat, and resistance is not an impenetrable

wall. And failure is an opportunity to ready oneself for the coming victory. “Do or die” is the Marine motto.

Though there is great value in a strong body, those who by nature are frail of body or are handicapped are just as capable of developing strong spirits. In reality, it is probably more common to see strength of spirit in a physically handicapped child or adult than in a naturally capable individual. It is fun for kids and parents when children excel physically, but it is even more of a pleasure to see bravery in a child that is crippled, blind, or in some way unable to match his peers. The principle remains the

same; push the boundaries of what you perceive as your limits, or what others tell you are your limits, and be an overcomer. Triumph. Achieve. Excel. It is not the height to which one climbs, rather how far one climbs above perceived limits that builds a strong spirit.

There are naturally talented or gifted children, performing far above their fellows, who remain weak in spirit because they have not been called upon to overcome in a wide spectrum of challenges. Again I say, it is not the level of expertise one achieves in relationship to the norm; it is the experience of facing the difficult, the scary, the painful, the boring, and even the impossible and believing in yourself enough to keep trying until you conquer.

This takes place when a ten-month-old conquers walking, when an eighteen-month-old successfully puts his pants on, and a two-year-old gets the courage to jump off the side of the pool into his father's arms. Character is formed and the spirit is strengthened when the five-year-old successfully conducts his daily chores of feeding the animals and gathering the eggs.

When the little four-year-old says, "Look, Daddy, see how strong I am," you need to look and acknowledge his strength, for though physical strength does profit a little, he is at that critical age in life when growth of the spirit is at a peak. If he thinks he is doing good, it is time to brag on his accomplishments.

Manned up

I remember a story one of our readers told of how she manned up her son. She had a loose cover plate on an electrical outlet and asked

her four-year-old to fix it. He got a screwdriver, only to discover that a flat-head screwdriver will not work on a Philips-head screw. So he located a screwdriver in the drawer that looked like the screw on the receptacle, and sure enough, it fit. He was elated with his prowess in problem solving. He felt like a real engineer. He fixed the loose plate and placed the screwdrivers back in the drawer. In that ten minutes of success he had grown two years older. For several days she told everyone they met that her son was taking care of the house, repairing everything broken, for he went around and "tightened" any screw he could find.

Early experiences of this sort will create a strong spirit in your child. To be shoved aside and told that he is not big enough will create a weak spirit that strives for attention in obnoxious ways that produce more rejection.

By the time they are two years old

At the moment, Deb and I have 19 grandkids and expect about ten or fifteen more—but not this year. As each grows in stature, I again have the opportunity to do another "clinical" study on child development. It is clear to me, by the time a child reaches his second birthday, his strength of spirit, or lack thereof, is already quite apparent. The first two years of a child's development is the most critical and telling. If the truth be known, children in the womb are

influenced by the emotional state of the mother.

The way you bend the sapling in its first two years will determine the way the tree leans. It is critical to maintain a positive and creative atmosphere during those first months. Build his confidence and boldness by manipulating his environment so he is always an overcomer. The two-year-old should be a winner in all things. To be a winner, there must be a game, a contest, a trial, a test of strength or mental expertise.

Confidence is built when a child manipulates objects in his environment: when he successfully drinks from a cup and is praised, when he puts on a garment, picks up after himself, or rides a rolling toy. When a child delights his parents with a page he colored or a pile of blocks he successfully stacked, he grows in his self-worth. The “can do” spirit is made from many little “I did” experiences. A spirit of “nothing can stop

me” grows out of overcoming many little barriers.

Learning to Steer Through Life

Just yesterday Deb and I took Parker, our 20-month-old grandson, on a ride in our little utility truck. We use it to haul manure and tools around on the farm, as well as kids. Deb asked Parker if he wanted to drive. He jumped out of her lap and stood between my legs grasping the steering wheel just like he knew what he was doing. Driving down the lanes, I showed him how to steer. He already had the general idea from small plastic toys he rode around the house. To our delight he was able to steer with my help, but he kept knocking my hand off the wheel. He wanted full control! So we opened the gate and drove into the front 12 acre pasture. There I gave him full control of the steering. He screamed his delight and triumph, navigating towards the cows. One time he got

stuck in a small turn radius and I had to help him straighten it out, but he soon started steering figure eights around the cows, making them move and protest. He yelled and hollered his triumph until Deb and I were laughing ourselves silly.

At less than two years of age, Parker is already such a man. There is no baby left in him. He wants to do man things, and if his daddy is not around to keep him entertained he will walk a hundred yards to find me somewhere on the farm working. He loves tools and work. I expect him to be pretty handy in about four years. When his daddy is not working him, I will be.

Being around the grandkids brings to mind the feelings and thoughts I had when my kids were growing up. As I let Parker drive, I knew that I was contributing to his eventual manhood. I was helping his daddy make him strong in spirit.

I do hope my reader can see the principle and spirit behind these

personal anecdotes. It is not necessary to duplicate my experience. Circumstances and environment are different for each of us. Find the challenges in your environment and participate with your children in fabricating fun in a constructive and rewarding fashion. But don't make the mistake of thinking that board games or iPod manipulation is going to make a child strong in spirit. It takes a hands-on experience in a shifting physical environment to create strength of spirit. Overcoming stress and frustration are essential to developing a strong spirit.

Navigating the swamp

Just last week my son Nathan, now thirty-two years old and married with four children, was reminiscing about one of the lessons he learned as a small child. We had a secret fishing hole deep in the swamps of the Mississippi River bottoms. It is an old river-run that floods in the spring and is replenished with fish.

It is surrounded by cypress trees ten to fifteen feet in diameter at water level. You can only get to the back-water lake by traveling across a very flat bottom land thick with hardwood trees five to six feet in diameter and straight as an arrow, the thick canopy blocking out the sunlight above. The trees are so tall, the squirrels only laugh at you when you try to shoot them out of the top branches with a shotgun. The boys and I loved that old fishing hole. Their grandpa fished there when he was a kid. We always took burlap bags to carry out the fish, leaving when we had caught all we could carry.

On our return trip after a morning of fishing, I would assign one of the boys as the leader of our expedition. When I appointed a boy as the leader I followed him even if he went the wrong direction and we ended up mired in the swamp, our way blocked by downed trees. He must discover his error and make adjustments accordingly.

As Nathan was recounting his experiences, he told how he would strike out leading the pack and every once in a while he would look back at my face to see if he could gather any sign as to whether or not he was going in the right direction. But he said my face was always stony, indifferent to where we were going.

I had taught them to read signs, how to use the sun and the moss on the trees, and to listen for distant sounds. Occasionally we could hear the faint sound of a tug-boat motor on the river about two miles away. The sound needed to be on our right as we made our way out. The moss on the trees needed to be facing us as we headed south. But there were those days when the sun

was not shining and the tug boats could not be heard and the moss seemed to have grown all around the trees in the thick, damp timber. When they first started taking turns leading us out, there were occasions when we walked an extra half mile or so before they got their bearings, but they were always successful in navigating the swamp and forest. On one or two occasions when I was leading the pack I had attempted to take a shortcut, not traveling over familiar territory, I had gotten totally turned around, ending up back where I started; so it was not a “walk in the park” as the saying goes.

Neither the boys nor the girls were ever soft and delicate. They were always wiry and muscular. The process of their physical development was fun for them and terribly entertaining for me. I took great pleasure in the prowess of my children, confident that in a world gone crazy they would survive and be leaders of those who stumble around without hope or direction.

After they became adults there were times when their physical strength saved their lives or enabled them to endure hardships in foreign lands while engaged in missionary activities. Read *Rebekah's Diary* and you will understand fully.

The greatest benefit of growing strong in body is what it does for the spirit of the child.

Leaders and followers

Society is composed of leaders and followers. It cannot be otherwise. Followers are essential to the overall good of society. Every engine needs a coal car and a caboose, as every visionary and entrepreneur needs capable men to carry out the vision. But every business needs a manager, and every shift needs a supervisor. Every department needs a head. Henry Ford didn't invent the automobile and he didn't build it. Men working by the hour built his empire.

There is no loss of self esteem or personal satisfaction in spending your life fulfilling someone else's

vision, but I covet the number one position for my children. I would rather not see them working by the hour, hoping for overtime, fearing a lay off, and concerned as to whether or not they can pay the mortgage. Strong spirited children grow up with a belief they can do it better. Strong spirited individuals are not afraid of failure, for they know that with further effort they will find the path to great success. They keep trying, and they enjoy the struggle.

Firstborn sons

It is a widely known and accepted fact that the leaders of nations, corporations, and armies are usually firstborn sons. Firstborn sons

are naturally thrust into leadership positions by virtue of their age and superior knowledge and strength. You expect the three-year-old to take responsibility for his little brother's safety. The three-year-old shares in the training and instruction of his younger brother. The older brother learns to relate to life as a leader, and the younger brother learns to relate as a follower, waiting to be told what to do, expecting to be countermanded in his decisions, and learning to accept it as the way of things.

The rule is confirmed by the exception. When there are five or more years separating brothers, the younger is likely to be a functional firstborn. Since his brother is too old to be his immediate overseer, the young boy faces responsibilities just as would a firstborn.

Functional firstborns mainly spend their initial years of life interacting with adults rather than their peers, so they are socialized by the more intelligent and sophisticated members of society. And when there are five or more years separating a child from his older siblings, he does not have any competition and his brothers and sisters are more likely to relate to him as adults, encouraging instead of competing.

When my younger son Nathan dropped by today, I read to him some of what you just read and he shared a couple observations that will be helpful. Nathan, offering an explanation as to why firstborns are more often dominant leaders, said, "It is easy to give the older kids the responsibilities because they already have skills and will perform the task

much more quickly and efficiently, but that leaves the younger children as observers of life rather than doers. The answer is to take care to put the younger children through the same regiment of responsibility as we did the older children.” That’s wise indeed. Learn from anybody you can.

John the Baptist was not deterred by unbelief and ridicule, because he was strong in spirit.

King David, the eighth son of Jesse, was a functional firstborn. He had dominant older brothers, but we find him in the hills alone with the sheep where he successfully defended them against a bear and a lion. As a lad he slew a giant in a duel, and went on to be a great general and warrior, a musician, and the most quoted poet in all history, eventually becoming the greatest king of Israel.

On the Farm

It is not necessary for second-born sons to grow up with a follower’s frame of mind. The one place where I often see several brothers in the same family and all of them confident leaders is on the farm. When I drive by and see my neighbor’s seven-year-old driving the tractor, delivering hay to the cows in the pasture, I know he will be strong in spirit. He is given responsibility according to his ability and he fulfills his duty with confidence that he is important in the daily flow of life. He has older brothers, but they are not out there telling him he is not doing it right. He is the “firstborn” when he is commanding that big tractor and managing a herd of cows. I conclude it is not the order of birth

or the personality type one displays early in life that determines the confidence and leadership qualities of a man; it is his early life experiences.

The Overcoming Amish Man

I have told the story before, but it bears repeating here. Years ago, when we first relocated to the country and began to minister to the Amish community, several of the young people felt a call to missions. In preparation, they decided to go to a missions oriented Bible college located out of state. One young man, about 25 years old, who had been raised Amish and had about a fifth grade education said he wanted to go to college. When he expressed his interest, I knew I had to talk him out of it. He was not worldly wise. He could read but not well, and had never developed study habits. I didn’t want him to be crushed by failure, so I explained how hard it was going to be and what it is like to study for tests night after night, weekend after weekend, month after month. He had been raised outdoors, walking behind a matched pair of mules or Belgian plow horses, never confined to books and study halls.

When I suggested he might not be able to make the grade, he looked amused and took on an air of patience as he said, “I can shoe any mule or horse, castrate a full grown bull, fix any motor, repair any farm equipment, and break a wild mustang to pull a buggy. I have never tried anything and failed to do it; I can do this also.” Such ill placed confidence! But I was wrong. I had underestimated the power of a strong human spirit. He went to college with his whole family—wife and kids. He struggled, studying long hours to make Ds his first semester. He moved up to Cs

his second, and then started making some Bs. He did it because he was “strong in spirit.”

John the Baptist was not deterred by unbelief and ridicule, because he was strong in spirit. Nor did his spirit fail when he was cast into prison, and it was still strong when they severed his head from his tough body. After John’s death, Jesus said that of those born of women there was not a greater prophet than John the Baptist.

The world is an unfriendly place and growing more hostile every day. As your children grow strong bodies, train them to be strong in spirit as well.


Remedial training

When my son Nathan was about eight years old, his aunt invited him over to bring her five year old son out of his timidity. He had a weak spirit—fearful of venturing into the woods fifty feet from their house. The little fellow was tall for his age but he grew up in the shadow of his older sister and lacked masculine boldness. So Nathan went over for the day and took along his gear—backpacks, knives, slingshots, BB gun, canteen, etc. He led his cousin out into the “wilds” where they spent

the day conquering nature. They discovered and captured various creatures—frogs, turtles, grub worms, beetles, bugs, snakes and the like. They swung on grape vines, climbed trees, and built a “fort,” conquering and dominating a two acre vacant lot. That was the day Cousin became an outdoorsman. To this day, Cousin hunts, fishes, and spends the night deep in the river basins, coming out in the morning with more food than he can carry. If the world fell into starvation, Cousin would be the man to know how to survive. In another day long ago, he would have been called “the food gatherer.”

The difference between a child sitting behind an LCD screen and one sitting in the top of a tree waiting for the game to enter the “kill zone” is the difference between a strong spirit of confidence and a weak spirit of timidity.

Training for Honesty

Explain how lies often multiply.

A great way to illustrate how lies multiply is to pull out a beautiful, perfect-looking apple and see if anyone wants it. While handing the apple to the blessed recipient, turn it to expose a mushy, brown side. When the proper, “Yuck!” response is received, explain that lies make us yucky like that apple. From a distance people may not see our lies, but as they get closer they will see how “yucky” our lies make us. Show how the apple got so disgusting. It started out with one small lie from a child saying he didn’t sneak a treat (hit the apple with something blunt). A small bruise is formed, but not too ugly. A child may get away with one small lie without anyone noticing, but lies often multiply. Suddenly, when a candy wrapper is found suspiciously on the floor by where he had been sitting, another lie is required to cover up the first one. (Hit the apple again.) The apple looks less appealing. Next a request is made to smell his breath and it is determined it smells

a lot like chocolate; now a bigger lie must be produced to maintain the initial lie. (Hit the apple hard.) Now, it is obvious that the child is lying, just like it is obvious the apple is not edible. **Moral: Lying is yucky.**






