



TWO-YEAR-OLD TROUBLE

A READER ASKS

My son is 2 years and 10 months. He is a bright, affectionate, patient, obedient child. Or at least he was until about 3–4 weeks ago. At that point he decided to start fighting me on EVERYTHING. Today I told him that he couldn't wear his shoes upstairs (he never wears his shoes in the house, far less upstairs, and he was already wearing just socks) and he



threw himself down on the stairs pouting. I told him to come talk to me, and when I picked him up he refused to look at me, and when I made him, he started screaming.

Then I told him he needed to eat his carrots at lunchtime (vegetables have been our number one battle his entire life, but had been going great the last year or so), and he had a gigantic tantrum. He screamed and yelled and refused to do

it. I gave him mild spankings, then he went back to the table and still refused. I told him he could go eat by himself and he told me no. So I gave him a good spanking and he laid across my lap screaming "NO! NO! I DON'T LIKE IT!!!" continually, refusing to be quiet. Eventually he gave in, but he was still angry, not repentant.

He will throw fits about the craziest things. Yesterday we went to the park, and my mom (who had played with him the whole time) asked if he had a good time. He definitely had, but decided to say "No!" I told him that wasn't true and it wasn't polite and he needed to say "Yes, thank you." He refused and threw himself down on the ground and made me drag him to the car (although he stood up right quick when I accidentally drug him through dog poop). Once in the car he tried to fight me on getting buckled and then tried to hit me.

He never used to hit me, but in the last week it is like his tantrums are not effective so he is trying more intense techniques. He refuses to answer me when I talk to him if he doesn't feel like it. Any time I ask him to do something he doesn't want to do, he throws himself on the floor either in a pouty lump (which to me is a quiet tantrum) or in a full-on screaming tantrum.

The only thing that has changed is that we have a new baby in the house (temporarily—we do foster care to adopt babies), but she arrived at the beginning of December and his attitude didn't go off until the beginning of February.

I can spank him for ten minutes and he is still screaming angrily at me to stop. Today my HAND has a broken blood vessel. I know you suggest a plumber's pipe, but my husband bought one that was way too big so I hate to use it, and end up using my hand most of the time.

[Note from Mike: I have never suggested a plumber's pipe be used to spank a child. That was the fabrication of a sodomite reporter for Salon magazine, picked up and quoted by The New York Times and repeated by CNN's Anderson Cooper, another anti-Christian sodomite, and repeated again by Dr. Drew, the BBC, and two dozen other media outlets. In my book *To Train Up a Child*, I wrote of how I saw an Amish woman wearing a ¼-inch plastic plumber's supply line around her neck on a string to be ready at hand when needed. It is flexible and will roll up in your pocket or purse. It is not PVC and it is not a pipe. I suggest any small instrument that is light and will not cause damage to tissue—like a kitchen utensil: spatula, wooden spoon, ¼-inch dowel rod, etc., but not your hand.]

I don't know what to do. I give him lots of love and affection, and I spend pretty much all my time with him. I TRY to use a friendly voice when giving direction (which gets hard to do when you know a battle is coming), and I try really hard to never spank in anger (although after ten minutes I am pretty close to angry!).

I have started sending him to his room the rest of the day after two episodes, because frankly I can't deal with any more, but I don't know if that is productive or not.

I know I was similar as a child, but my mother was never able to break me of it, and I still struggle every day with my defiant attitude toward my husband. I know it is a terrible example, and I accept this might be part of the problem and am working on it, but I don't think it is the WHOLE problem.

Is there something I am missing? I

have To Train Up a Child but have misplaced it (I tend to stuff it away somewhere when I know the social workers are coming over, because while I think it is a wonderful training manual, I know they might beg to differ).


I guess my main question is: how much spanking is too much? Should I punish him for the pouting, or just let it go? It seems like such a defiant, bad attitude to me, but am I expecting too much? Is it wrong to give a warning when his behavior is wrong? Should I just spank him and let the switch tell the story?

Please help me! I miss my sweet little boy, and I desperately want him back.

I want to clarify, I don't spank him nonstop for ten minutes straight. I spank him a few times, tell him to stop screaming, wait ten to thirty seconds, and if he isn't trying to obey I spank him a few more times, and so on. I give him a swat every time he screams no (or something similar) at me. But I'm not whaling on him for ten minutes, it just takes a ten-minute block of time sometimes for him to submit.

MIKE ANSWERS

The principle you are attempting to follow is traditional, intuitive, and biblical. It works for most people, but right now it is not working for you. So something is missing. I am not suggesting that you are a bad parent. There are many variables that may be beyond your control or understanding. Many parents will have great success on their first two or three children and then out of nowhere, as if the new child is a different species, they have inexplicable trouble just as you describe. The usual methods fail to produce good results. Like you, they will have self-doubt and be perplexed,



blaming themselves.

Good parents who suddenly experience the exact same exacerbating behavior have asked me what they can do to help their child. Unless I could observe your interaction with the child and hear your answers to several questions, I could not even begin the process of understanding what is missing. So I will use the shotgun approach.

In some rarer cases the child's normal propensity to selfishness is not readily conquered because of some underlying physical deficiency, causing a chemical imbalance in the brain.

Sometimes the behavior you describe is triggered by a change in the social setting, like conflict in the home, or, as you indicated, the introduction of a baby that the child perceives to be a threat to his station.

Sometimes it is the result of sexual or physical abuse that provokes angry behavior.

A child left to himself, not part

of a vital circle of fellowship (causing low self-esteem), will act out because he doesn't have any allegiance to the family group. You cannot measure the appropriate level of fellowship based on what your other children required. Every child is different in temperament, some requiring additional affirmation that they are cherished.

But most common is the fact that children in their third year discover their autonomy and learn they can manipulate their environment for the advancement of pleasure, and they resent anyone who says no to them or who resists their self-indulgence. In attempting to address this defiance, sometimes parents trigger a competitiveness in the child that causes him to stand his ground in defiance. It takes much more effort to get the little rebel to lay down his arms. It is a special case that seems to defy the normal principles of child training. But there is a way.

RESTATING CHILD TRAINING PRINCIPLES

For the sake of our readers, especially those who are new to our material, I will briefly state the concept of traditional, common-sense child training. Children, like adults, are complex souls of conflicting

drives and emotions. They come into the world with all of the passion and lust but with none of the wisdom or self-control. To say it another way, small children have a gas pedal but no steering wheel and no will to apply the brakes. Infants, toddlers, and small children require steering and restraint. Parents must apply the brakes from time to time whether the children like it or not. Children must be made to submit to the oversight of caretakers, for *"a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame"* (Proverbs 29:15b).

When children are a little older (4 or 5) they are more responsive to being guided through reason and modeled behavior, but when they are two or three years old, reason is about as useful as a set of encyclopedias. Furthermore, good modeling goes unnoticed by a 2-year-old, whereas bad modeling seems to be very contagious at any age, more so when they are very young. A 2-year-old will pick up a lousy attitude like a cold in a toy store.

All psychologists and so-called "child rearing experts" agree that parents and caretakers must set boundaries, or "limits" as they sometimes call them. They also agree that parents must "enforce" those boundaries. One psychologist says, "If you don't set and stick to clear limits, your kids will push and push until they get their way." But the professionals don't offer any definitive means that parents can employ to "enforce" limits. "Time outs," where children are sent into isolation for a period of time, are not enforcement; they are abdication of authority to the attrition of time. The entire Bible verse quoted above is: *"The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame"* (Proverbs 29:15).



All authorities must have the power to force compliance by means of layered and measured negative consequences; otherwise limits and boundaries are dismissible personal preferences. Policemen will give you a ticket. Schools and universities will fail you. Judges will sentence you to prison. Employers will fire you. The IRS will take everything you own. If at two o'clock in the morning you don't observe the boundary that is your neighbor's back door he may shoot you. Children without enforced boundaries grow up to be selfish losers, or worse, criminals. And they will likely be as poor as a Democrat in the inner city.

If you are going to prepare your children to live in the real world of boundaries, you must model the home after the rules they must play by when they enter the real world. You do that by having rules and consistent consequences. That is, when they cross the red line they should meet with irresistible force, as they will in society.

Children will test the boundaries by various means until they discover the weakness of the authority, and then they double down on independent selfish action until they are in control and can indulge with minimal consequences.

Now this is key to understanding the tantrums of a child. When parents are not consistent in forcing compliance, or when the consequences are not of sufficient severity to discourage bad behavior, the child's heart is hardened against the concept of the rule of law. When parents administer discipline only at the end of an intolerance curve so that the child is sometimes allowed to break the rules with impunity, he gets a taste of the autonomous indulgence and takes it to be his due, his right. If it feels good, he does it. If it doesn't feel good, he refuses, and he gets away with his rebellion often enough to love it like a gambler loves gambling when he wins only 10% of the time. The obsession to win—or, in the child's

case, to indulge—is so powerful and addictive that the child will suffer the half-hearted consequences 90% of the time in anticipation of breaking free on those occasions when he is not punished. Therefore, the child will never appreciate or accept the times when consequences are enforced. Conversely, he will feel that he is being treated unjustly, because he has developed a permissive worldview in which consequences have no place. He is like a hippie in college on an irrevocable fixed income. If you dare step between him and his autonomous indulgence, he will hate you for it, believing you just want him to be miserable. When that happens, spankings cease to be effective and produce more resentment and anger.

Generally speaking, spanking is only effective on small children who have not yet developed the ability to comprehend logical exhortation—up to four or five years old. There are exceptions, but space does not allow us to visit that subject further. See my books: *To Train Up a Child* and *No Greater Joy*, volumes 1–3 [see pg. 32].

OBSERVATION IN ANSWER TO THE LETTER

He feels he is being treated unjustly, so he is treating you as an enemy whom he wants to defy and hurt.

You expressed concern that your spankings may be inappropriate given the fact that they are not working. Your instinct is correct. All forms of discipline are effective only when they result in a good attitude. Conformity of actions is not our goal, rather conformity of attitude.

Normally, a child who is disciplined or spanked will surrender his will, resulting in a purging of conscience and cheerfulness from a sense that all indebtedness is paid and the rule of law prevails. Forced obedience is necessary to break the stubbornness of the child, but, as you well know, if it fails to result in a gentle spirit, it is counterproductive.

There are several questions I would need answered before I could determine the right mixture and dosage. Sometimes we do the right things but we do them disproportionately or out of order. In the end, raising children is an art form administered from the heart; it must be intuitive. Hard, fast rules or procedures blindly administered are not likely to be effective.

Is your son natural born to you or adopted? There are many reasons why adopted children can be much harder to raise.

What is his attitude toward the new baby? Are you including him in the parenting and nurturing of the new child? You should.

Does he have times when he manifests a quiet, gentle, compliant spirit? Is his rebellion fairly constant or is there a trigger?

You didn't say anything about the father. What role does he play? What is their relationship?

Is he the first born or first adopted child? If he is adopted, at what age did that occur? If adopted, what were his physical and mental conditions before you received him?

Does he interact with other children? How so? Is it just authority he rebels against or does he express a general state of hostility?



My books, CDs, and MP3s express the ageless principles of child training that have proven to work extremely well in millions of homes when properly understood and applied. But children are not simple machines that can be properly assembled by following the directions. And parents are not all created equal. I cannot tell you exactly what you need to do, feel, or say that will work magic in your situation. The simple, correct answer has proven to be effective in the great majority of cases, but we are complex creatures, sometimes with indefinable inadequacies. In the final analysis, you must learn all you can and then follow your heart and intuition.

WHAT I WOULD DO

If I were to take in a foster child (which we did for about fifteen years) who acted as your son does, and I were allowed to spank and discipline as I saw fit (which is never the case with foster children), I would start

by winning the little guy's heart, causing him to be addicted to my fellowship, putting him in a position where my approval and praise become the most important thing in his life. That is not achieved by sentimental praise and approval. It is achieved by sharing the daily events of home and family. It is achieved by engaging him in the fellowship of overcoming a challenge together—like moving a washing machine away from the wall so you can clean behind it, or carrying the trash to the street together, or painting a picture, baking a cake, etc.

Since spanking and severe reprimand would just confirm his sense of isolation and feed his “me vs. them” worldview, I would apply a different form of ultimate force until I had gained his confidence and admiration.

The principle is that you as the lawgiver must win all contests of will. You must be the chief potentate and he the obedient servant to the

rule of law. He will still be a boy and still be self-willed under the best of circumstances. There will still be showdowns and confrontations. Where spanking would normally resolve a contest of wills in a matter of seconds, you will have to be more creative and take a lot of extra time.

YOU PROVIDED AN EXAMPLE

“Then I told him he needed to eat his carrots at lunchtime (vegetables have been our number-one battle his entire life, but had been going great the last year or so) and he had a gigantic tantrum. He screamed and yelled and refused to do it. I gave him mild spankings, then he went back to the table and still refused. I told him he could go eat by himself and he told me no.”

You set this contest up for failure. I have repeatedly said and written, “Never create a challenge to make a child eat something he doesn’t want.” To win that contest you may have to resort to an induced coma and tube feeding [For all my enemies, that’s a joke]. Pick your contests. In the early stages of training, make far fewer demands; completely ignore many things that concern you but need not be made into a contest where you could lose.

How could you have addressed the eating situation? When children have a great variety of things to eat, and they can eat tasty snacks between meals, why would they eat carrots now when they just had junk food two hours ago and will have junk food again in a couple hours? Their favorite meals are between meals. The eating contest is cured when you go shopping. Sugar is more addictive

than heroin. Never buy anything processed, and purge your home of all sugary products. Serve healthy food only and snacks can be leftovers. Then the child will know that you are not holding out on him and there is nothing tasty hidden in the cabinet that he may get with enough begging and whining. He can eat anything in the house. In time he will get hungry and eat his spinach and carrots. If he complains, just smile and say, “That’s okay, you don’t have to eat it; eat what you want and we will save the rest for dinner.” You win. He loses. You are boss. No spanking. He makes the right choice eventually—when he gets hungry enough.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE YOU PROVIDED

“Today I told him that he couldn’t wear his shoes upstairs (he never wears his shoes in the house, far less upstairs, and he was already wearing just socks) and he threw himself down on the stairs pouting. I told him to come talk to me, and when I picked him up he refused to look at me, and when I made him, he started screaming.”

When you know how he is going to respond to a challenge, don’t show up as the opposing team to battle it out. Anticipating his reaction, arrange

circumstances to your advantage. Once you have told him not to wear his shoes upstairs, turn away and ignore his response. He “threw himself down on the stairs pouting” is a form of speech and manipulation. It worked. You took the bait, allowing him to manipulate your emotions further. He refused to look at you because, as a rebel, he was compelled to win the contest of wills. If he couldn’t best you in the shoe game, he would best you by not assuming the compliant spirit you expected. When you lose your cheerfulness and cut off the fellowship in frustration, he wins. It is the same spirit seen in a terrorist who blows himself up to make a point or the monk who sets himself on fire in the streets. He wins the contest of wills by his ultimate sacrifice. The worst thing you can do with a group of rowdy protesters is take notice.

Once you command him to not wear his shoes upstairs, turn and walk away smiling. All is well. You won. Remember, if a child falls down in a protest pout and no one hears or sees it, there was no protest. Here he is on the stairs pouting and you are in the kitchen singing and having fun, not caring one way or the other. You won.

I was once babysitting a child who threw himself down in protest, and when I pretended to ignore it and turned away, he jumped up and got around in front of me, repeating the display of disappointment. I laughed to myself and walked in the bedroom, again ignoring the protest. To my amazement and great entertainment, he followed me into the bedroom, jumped in front of me, and repeated

his brokenhearted response, throwing himself down like it was the first time. This time I good naturedly laughed at him and dismissed his response as a source of entertainment. He got up and walked away, never trying that form of hate speech on me again. I won. And best of all, he won in character development.

What if he did defy you and wear his shoes upstairs? Then express alarm and grab the vacuum cleaner. Sternly and quickly rebuke him, and then cheerfully and hastily relieve him of his shoes—five seconds. Pay no attention to his response, and ask him to help you vacuum the floor where he walked. While vacuuming, express your concern for the soiled floor in a tone of camaraderie. Maintain a “we are in this together to keep our floor clean” attitude. You won. He lost. Remember, if you don’t see a pout, it didn’t happen.

In normal parenting, one swat with a switch and the shoes stay downstairs. All is well and there is no attitude problem. But for reasons yet undetermined, yours is a special situation that will require a heart of patience and a good deal of creativity. Others in your situation have overcome; you can as well.



One day when I was 8 years old, I went down to the mailbox to get the mail. Lying in the grass near the mailbox was a magazine with a solid white cover. I assumed some of our mail had escaped the mailman and I went over to pick it up. The magazine fell open in the middle, and for about three seconds I stared in amazed horror at the hard porn in front of me. A dozen conversations and statements that my dad had made about such things came rushing to my mind. ▶▶

Once during a trip to Memphis with our family, I recalled seeing on a downtown street a half-dressed woman being jerked around and slapped by a man in a pink suit.

“She’s a prostitute,” Dad told us. “He’s a pimp. She works for him, selling her body to lascivious men who will burn in hell so that she can continue to buy drugs to satisfy her addiction. God hates prostitution and pornography, kids. It destroys lives and families.” We kids stared in horror at the man and woman who were now stumbling into a building with neon signs and blacked-out windows.

“Do you know what pornography is?” Dad persisted. We stared at him, still shaken by what we had just seen. “It is photographs of naked men and women... and other things I won’t even tell you about.”

“Why do those women let people take pictures of them when they are naked?” we asked.

“Most of those women were molested when they were kids, by their uncles, their brothers, by friends, or even by complete strangers. They have no self-value. They feel worthless, and so they don’t guard their bodies. Instead, they sell their bodies for money to worthless

men who are molesting other women and girls.” We all swallowed hard and shuddered.

“God hates this kind of sin so much that when the children of Israel went into Canaan, he told Joshua to kill every man, woman, and child because they had all been involved in sexual sins. God says it is better for a man to have a big grinding stone tied around his neck and be thrown into the sea to drown than to face the wrath of God that will come on him if he messes with little kids that way.” We all nodded. It would be a just retribution for such an evil person.

“Whenever you see pornography, kids, I want you to turn away from it—don’t look at it, because it will stay in your mind and bother you for years. Wad it up and burn it, or throw it away so no one else will ever see it. And don’t trust anybody. If an uncle or cousin wants to talk to you about this kind of stuff—or touch you—I want you to scream at the top of your voice and run away and tell on them. Don’t be polite or wait to see if he’s really a bad guy or not. The first minute you feel as though something is wrong, run away from that person.” Dad went on to give us detailed instructions about protecting ourselves and our minds. All of this

I OFTEN WONDERED WHAT OUR REACTION TO PORNOGRAPHY WOULD HAVE BEEN IF DAD HAD NEVER TOLD US ABOUT IT

came to my memory the moment that pornographic magazine fell open in my 8-year-old hands. Even though I had never seen pornography before, I instantly knew what it was. A righteous indignation swelled up inside of me, and I crumpled the magazine up as small as I could get it and carried it home. I took it straight to Dad and told him about it. We set it on fire, and I felt a grim satisfaction for having destroyed one small piece of evil in my world.

When my brothers were 10 and 12 years old, they found pornography stapled to the trees in the woods where some filthy hunter had left it for the Amish kids to find. My brothers reacted the same way I had. They approached each tree with their back to it, pulled down the pages and wadded them up into tight balls, stuffed them in their backpacks, and brought them home to burn.

I have often wondered what our reaction to pornography would have been if Dad had never told us about it. What if we hadn't known what kind of people create it and use it and what God thinks about it? He even told us what to do WHEN we ran into it—not IF! Dad knew the world was so corrupt that there was no way he could shield us entirely. So he equipped us to handle the corruption ourselves. If I had never heard of pornography that day when I picked up the magazine, I think my own shocked curiosity would have led me to turn the pages and begin the searing of my conscience. Then my sense of guilt would have kept me from telling

my parents what I had found. And what would I have done with the magazine? Hidden it? I don't know. But the truth and knowledge I held that day assured my freedom and safety. I thank God so much for what Dad did for us!

When I was 14, we (my brothers and I) were swimming in the creek with our neighbors—three boys the same ages we were: 14, 12, and 10. A perverted-looking local drove by our swimming hole repeatedly, leering



out the window at us. My brother Gabe made a comment about him probably being a queer. Our 14-year-old friend looked curious and asked, “What’s a queer?”

My brother replied, “You know—a faggot.” The boy shook his head in confusion. Gabe said, “A homosexual.” Still not understanding, the 14-year-old, homeschooled neighbor boy just shook his head. Gabe laughed, sure that his friend was playing dumb.

“Come on! You’ve got to know what a queer is. You know, guys that mess with other guys or boys. Perverts!”

To this day, I can remember the look on the other boy’s face. It was ▶▶

NOT a look of surprise and curiosity. It was a look that said, "There's a word for it? You know about that? Do other people know about it? Do you know . . . ?" I felt sorry for our friend that day. I wondered what experiences he had run into—unprepared and unwarned.

Many times as a child I remember standing at Dad's side when he would go into a gas station to prepay for fuel. If the station carried pornography, Dad would scrape his money back off the counter and tell the cashier that he could not buy gas there because he just noticed they promoted rape and child molestation. The cashier would look shocked, and Dad would point at the porn magazines behind him. The cashier ALWAYS looked guilty and ashamed. He would glance at us kids; we would all be looking at him with suspicious shock (are you a child

molester???) before we turned and walked out. These incidents burned a sure reaction into us. Dad's reaction and openness about sin and God's hatred of sin all gave us assurance in dealing with the world when Dad wasn't around.


Knowing Good and Evil— from God's Perspective of Good is wise

Our parents also made sure we understood the difference between righteous sexuality and evil sexuality. There was a clear distinction in our minds. When we were very small, Dad candidly explained that God created all beings, male and female, for pleasure and reproduction. God created sex to be pure and holy between one man and one woman, who would eventually be Mommy and Daddy to a whole passel of kids. There wasn't supposed to be any confusion or shame in that relationship. It was intended by God to be whole, functional, and happy.

When our dogs were mating, Dad called us outside to see what they were doing, then told us to go back inside and give them some privacy. Inside at the kitchen table, he sat down with a paper and pen and drew a picture for us of sperm swimming up a canal to an egg. He gave us a thorough, practical explanation of reproduction. We were 8, 6, 4, and 2 years old. Knowledge can bring wisdom.

Our parents gave us a happy understanding of marriage by letting us see them hug, kiss, and enjoy each other's company. They never gave us the specifics of sex, but often assured us that marriage was great



and God had someone wonderful in store for each of us if we stayed pure and walked in righteousness until it was time to get married. This great example, contrasted with occasional glimpses of the ugliness of sin, made it easy for me to make up my mind to wait for the best.

Many parents write to us saying that they are trying to protect their children's innocence. They don't want them to know about the evil in the world. I understand their concern. It is a sad thing that we live in a world where evil has such free reign,

where child porn is an accepted part of society. It is sickening. I hope the Lord returns for us soon and breaks the teeth of the ungodly before he casts them into the lake of fire, where they will be in torment for eternity. But the truth is that children are going to come across the reality of our corrupt society one way or another. They will either hear it from a twisted pervert, another clueless kid who is making poor guesses and choices, Hollywood, a book, the Internet... or from you. Which source do you want them to get it ►►

from first? Dad made sure he was the first to tell us life's secrets; he made sure his information was the most thorough and complete; and he made sure we knew everything from the standpoint of good rather than evil.

Dad, Are You Keeping the World Out?

The most amazing thing about the rise of pornography on the Internet is not how many children have gotten involved, but how many “mature, responsible people” have gone off the deep end. People who thought they were safe in their own righteousness have fallen into immorality. *No Greater Joy* receives letters from pastors, elders, and fathers who have professed Christianity for years but are now in the tangle of pornography. They were unprepared for temptation in their own home. They never learned to stand and fight and resist the devil.

Shutting evil out of your life is not really an act of righteousness. Just about the time believers learn to deal with pornography on the web,

some greater and more insidious evil will be introduced by the world at large. The answer is something more aggressive—and more fundamental! The answer is to believe the gospel, the reality of your sanctification—that you are dead to sin and alive unto God. In this stand of faith, you will worship God in the Spirit and have no confidence in the flesh. You will walk after the Spirit and thus not fulfill the lust of the flesh. You will be free from sin right down to the most secret and fundamental part of your being. When Paul wrote Romans and told the believers that they should “through the Spirit... mortify the deeds of the body,” he wasn't talking about some Sunday-school rules that they should abide by. Half-baked “churchianity” is never enough to overcome the world. If you are not overcoming sin, you need to listen to Mike's audio series called *Sin No More* [see pg. 37]. Mike's series on Romans Chapters 1–8 is available for free on YouTube. Another powerful resource is the video *Science of Addiction and the Brain* [see pg. 36].

Even the most secluded and conservative families will be assaulted. Shutting out as much evil as you can is your God-given duty to your children, but you will never be able to shut it all out. On top of that, you cannot make your children pure by insulating and isolating their circumstances. You must train, teach, and prepare their minds to respond to the Spirit of God. Read our *Yell and Tell* books [see pg. 19] to your little ones; read the books at least once a week and give the child an opportunity to talk about what you have read. All experts on the subject agree that those prepared are usually spared. ■

Questions to Provoke a Discussion with your Children

- *What are these things?*
- *Who does them?*
- *What is the penalty for these sins?*
- *What did God do to the nations that practiced these things?*
- *What will he do to the individual offender?*

This should not be a one-time discussion. Let the information flow as naturally as possible. Let there be an openness in your conversation that will give your children confidence to continue to ask questions. Dad did not call a “church” meeting when he discussed these things. It was “a little here and a little there,” in the context of daily life. If we saw a broken individual or read something in the paper or heard a friend discussing a sad situation, Dad would speak of the sin, what the Bible said, and how the sin had caused such pain. He did not hide the gossip of sin from us; he used it as an illustration of good and evil. He made the concept of sowing and reaping part of our daily communication; evil brings judgment and death; righteousness brings reward and life.

NOTE: Don’t use this as an occasion to “accuse or excuse” other believers by nitpicking them based on your personal convictions, which are often a result of your own life of sin (past or present). We have never known children that have come out of this judgemental type of home to do well, regardless of how glorious they seemed as children.



Shoshanna's Testimony

I sat in church one morning listening to my dad preach. I had been “saved” a few years before. I remembered the time I had cried and asked God into my heart. I hung onto that moment when I cried and felt those feelings as proof of my salvation. I worked to show fruit—praying, witnessing, being as righteous as I could—as I thanked God for paying it all. But no matter how many “good” things I did, it did not make up for my heart, and I would doubt. Then I would pray and rebuke the devil while singing, witnessing, and trying to be more righteous. Trying to strengthen myself in Him and quench my doubts, I would remember “that moment” and “my fruit” and then I would work hard to stand in Him.

That day at church, I sat there thinking about my “salvation” experience, my “righteousness,” and

my amazing dad, and I realized that I had tried everything I could try. I had done everything that I could do. I knew that I could try the rest of my life, make others believe I was saved, and even convince myself some days; but late at night those doubts would come back, and fear of hell would haunt me. I saw my life passing before me—trying and failing. I saw myself on Judgment Day and I knew what my argument would be because I had made it with myself often: “Yes, I am saved. I watched *Ee-Taow* [available on pg. 36] and saw people hearing truth and getting saved. I was moved and I cried. I was so thankful that Jesus died for the world, and I said the sinner’s prayer. I am Mike Pearl’s daughter and I grew up with my dad reading and studying the Bible every day. I knew truth. I witnessed and won people to the Lord. I prayed and God answered.”

Pickled Beets

- 2 small beets
- 1 cup water
- 1 tsp. honey
- 1 tsp. parsley
- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup vinegar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ tsp. sea salt
- 1 tsp. lemon zest

Bible study at Curtis' house. Plus, someone gave me the book *The Late Great Planet Earth* by Hal Lindsey, and I read it along with an RSV I had. It took time for the Holy Spirit to work on me. Over the month of October the fog started to lift off my darkened soul. I wanted to know God but my mind was so buzzed with all the acid I had taken. On Sunday, October 31, 1970, about 11 people came forward for salvation and I went with them. One of the petitioners was Cathy Saunders, and I thought, "How could a professing Christian and sweet mother like her be lost?" I think I got baptized that night but things were still not clear and I didn't think I was saved the next morning. My mind was just so full of drugs and corruption, plus Satan had had full reign for so long

he just wouldn't give up easily. You (Mike) called for a special Tuesday meeting since it was obvious God was moving.

On Monday, I walked around the yard thinking I was lost. I was unhappy and all the people in church seemed to exude joy—cherubic old women (they were in their 40s) and happy people. I was not a part of anything. I didn't have connection to anything of purity or happiness. Monday night I went to the Bible study feeling pretty low but not talking to anyone about how I was thinking.

Tuesday came around and I still felt isolated. I thought about doing coke (the drug) until I died. It just didn't seem like I could get what the sweet folks of the church had, but the evening special service was coming

up so I got on my BSA (motorcycle) and headed out. I had just passed over the Loosahatchie Bridge when the motor sputtered and quit and I coasted to a stop on the side of the road. There was such darkness that November night and I was out of gas five minutes before the meeting was due to start. My mind immediately went back to days of mindless sin with too many drugs; in that state there was no caring or struggle about anything. But praise be to God, he was there for me even then.

Not one minute after I ran out of gas, a fellow stopped who had a gas can in his car. An angel? Only God knows, but I was on my way again. I walked in with the service already started and I announced that I was filled with devils and needed prayer. Mike called me to the altar and several men laid hands on me and prayed, and then I went back to my seat. Mike preached on coming to God through Jesus and drew a picture of Jesus on the cross. The cloud of doubt was lifted as I listened to the beautiful sacrifice Jesus made for me. At the invitation Mike told me to go to the inquiry room with Ed Morris, who has now been gone from this world for many years. Brother Morris held up the Bible and asked if I believed it was the Word of God. There was a struggle. Was it or was it not? The Holy Ghost won and I said I did believe. He opened to 1 John 5 and started reading verse 9. He showed me that the witness of God was superior to anything man has said, and I trusted what God said at that moment.

The next few days I doubted, but like Peter, I walked on the water, and when I felt like I was sinking I cried out to God to save me. On a couple of occasions I have approached

the throne and asked for assurance. When someone as wicked as I was can be accepted in the beloved, I know there is hope for everyone. Southside's song leader Perry Burns said I reminded him of the devil-possessed man of the Gadarenes. Debi's dad said he knew a devil when he saw one (having been one himself, I suspect), and told the girls in the church if I bothered them he would kill me. Thank God a child of disobedience was quickened. A few years later God let me marry Debi's cousin, Freida. It has been 44 good years of loving and honoring God and having a good, loving woman to stand by my side. Only God in his mercy and kindness...

Fast-Forward 45 Years

Anyway, what I want to tell you about is more up-to-date. Freida and I just returned from a trip to Europe doing a street-preaching blitz with missionary Nico Verhoef. We preached at the busy markets in Switzerland, Austria, Germany, and the Netherlands. YES, we preached at the market in Berlin where two weeks later people were killed by ISIS. We can't help but wonder if some of those who were killed heard the preaching but walked on by. We are praying that some who may have heard will now take it to heart and get serious about their souls.

Nico says that he had his eyes opened to the necessity of street preaching through my ministry (Banners Unfurled), so that the men he has trained to street preach are my grandchildren. If so, this means they are your (Mike's) great-grandchildren. Shortly after I was saved you took me out on the street to help while you did some street

preaching. That was in 1971. Street work got into my blood and I have followed this path since.

The scripture banners I designed years ago have been a real asset to street preaching. They are a simple, lightweight system that enables them to be hoisted above the heads of a crowd. There is no way to count the many conversations that have been initiated with people just by asking me, "Can you explain the banner?" You can see in these few pictures of the great crowds in Europe how effective the banners are as a visual aid. Notice how the people are examining the banners with obvious great interest even when they won't stop.

While in Europe, we traveled to ten cities in twelve days and spent hours on the streets preaching and handing out tracts with

THOUSANDS of people thronging us everywhere we went. Ten other men joined us at different times to preach in various cities. The people are for the most part quietly disdainful and walk on by, but you can see that some were willing to stop and talk. As we went to Wittenberg (where God started the Reformation through Martin Luther) and stayed in a hostel on the Elbe River (on which William Tyndale fled to Hamburg to translate the scripture), we could not help feeling

like we were part of biblical history and a part of something bigger than ourselves, and we thanked God for the privilege.

Street preaching is easy but it helps to have some training from men who have done it. This is why I started the annual Beale Street Blast in 1999. Thousands of people will flood into Memphis for the big Memphis in May Festival, and we will be there with men and women from all over the country, standing with our banners, passing out tracts, and preaching the gospel. It was during one of the Beale Street Blasts that Bro. Verhoef caught of street preaching and started training men to fan out across

Europe with the gospel this way.

If a young man wants to do something that will count for eternity, he should think about a lifetime of public preaching. At the May 4–6 Blast, we will spend some time teaching how to street preach and make banners (to take home), and will explain the need for prayer. We will enjoy plenty of great music, fellowship, and food. We extend a hearty WELCOME to anyone who wants to learn how to minister the gospel.

Love doesn't come without a sacrifice—the decision to lay aside negativity and embrace joy and thanks.

And that is, perhaps, the greatest thing any woman can do for her family.
