# To Train Up A Child

by Michael Pearl

*“Your job as a parent is to make your child socially desirable by the age of four.” -Dr. Jordan Peterson*

I wish I had constructed that sentence. I have expressed the same sentiment a hundred ways, though never so succinctly and precisely. Jordan Peterson is not a professing believer in Jesus Christ. He is a sincere and thoughtful clinical psychologist who demonstrates great insight into

human nature. He sees many emotionally twisted adults who have difficulty functioning normally. He recognizes the source of most adult maladjustment as beginning in the first four years of life.

The Word of God offers the solution: *“Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it”* (Proverbs 22:6). Children come into the world untrained, uncultured, geared toward

complete selfishness. It is the parents' duty to train up a child in the way he should go. Otherwise he will go his own way. And *"a child left to himself bringeth his mother to shame"* (Proverbs 29:15).

I have often said, "What a child is at four he will be at forty." If by four years of age you have not molded the little ones to be happy and thankful, creative and positive, they will have problems for the rest of their lives. The arrow is aimed in those early years, its trajectory determined. Later in life they may exercise their free wills to practice self-denial and persistently reject those natural tendencies imparted in the first four years, but they will always be like the alcoholic that must make an effort to stay "on the wagon" of right thinking and doing. An unthankful four-year-old will be an unthankful

adult, or an adult that must put forth an effort to express thankfulness. I have lived long enough to see this reality demonstrated in several generations.

Dr. Peterson put it so well: ". . . make your child socially desirable . . ." That is the perfect objective test of our parenting. When people who know your child seek him out to carry on a conversation and you see their satisfied grin and absolute delight at his manner, you have made him "socially desirable." When you are proud to take your three- or four-year-old into adult company, never fearing he will embarrass you, it is because you know he is socially desirable. *"A wise son maketh a glad father: but a foolish son is the heaviness of his mother"* (Proverbs 10:1).

Many times I have observed the results of poor parenting in the

father/son relationship. A syndrome begins by about age four as the father negatively reacts to his son's foolish manner. The father is disappointed and pushes his son away with criticism and rejection. The son's foolishness increases, and by the time he is ten years old

there is obvious open hostility. A stern, commanding father may establish a regime where the son is tacitly obedient, but his obedience is that of a servant, not a son. The time will come when the "servant" will become obstinate and express open rebellion. *"A servant will not be corrected by words: for though he understand he will not answer"* (Proverbs 29:19). *"And, ye fathers, provoke not your children to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord"* (Ephesians 6:4). Any time a child is provoked to wrath, it is the fault of the parenting style.

Mother sees the harm being done to the son, and, in a misguided attempt to bring balance, swings the pendulum in the opposite direction. She overindulges her son and excuses his foolishness as she seeks to protect him. As the child bounces between two harmful extremes he is the recipient of a well-rounded, social misfit upbringing.

There are many degrees of poor

parenting—and of good parenting as well. No parent is so balanced as to perfectly train up a child. Life throws many curveballs and none of

us are so wise and attentive as to hit every ball out of the park for the benefit of our children. We win or lose in various de-

grees. We just hope in some measure to be on the winning side for the sake of our children. I think all parents leave their children unfinished in various measures. When children become adults they must perfect their flaws and hone their gifts to become all they can be. Those who don't will pass on their flaws to the next generation.

We can be certain that we will leave our children with plenty of distance to travel to reach perfection. There comes a time when the parental umbilical cord is cut and they take charge of their own lives. What we instill by four years of age will be the foundation of all we attempt thereafter and the foundation on which they will continue to build their lives. A well-laid foundation will extend into all future generations, as will one poorly laid. God said of Abraham, *"For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the*

*LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him*" (Genesis 18:19). **God chose Abraham because of his parenting skills.** Wow! Read that again.

Enough of the negative. We must understand the road carelessly traveled that brought us to desolate parenting if we are to avoid the same mistake with the next child. Furthermore, though a child's character and temperament are formed by the time he is four years old, if we understand the principles, there is much we can do to train the older child to *"refuse the evil, and choose the good"* (Isaiah 7:15). We can partner with our children, (even the arrows poorly aimed), to walk in truth and make the right choices based on a love of righteousness. It is a steeper road than the one we could have traveled before they were four, but a road many have successfully climbed. *"Correct thy son, and he shall give thee rest; yea, he shall give delight unto thy soul"* (Proverbs 29:17).

So, on the practical side, how do we make our children socially desirable by the time they are four years old? I can best answer that with real-life examples. It has been so long since I had children I have forgotten most of my experiences, but every day I see fresh examples

of little ones being trained up in the way they should go. My youngest daughter, Shoshanna, living nearby, is a beautiful example of excellent child training. Her four children range in age from a boy sixteen to a one-year-old girl. In her training I see some recycling of the way we trained her and some new or different ways that are her own creation.

A parent must relate to his child the same way God relates to his children: law, love, instruction, provision, fellowship, chastisement, grace, and forgiveness, all in a spirit of good will with a common shared hope for the future. The list is not chronological; all things occur simultaneously. Such a list can seem overwhelming, and it would take another book to cover the subject; so I will sum it up: the most important aspect of child training is not the technique; it is the spirit of the parent. Having the Holy Spirit indwell a parent may be the only way to be an effective child trainer.

Children are properly reared by excessive eye-to-eye contact. When a child can look in your eyes and see approval, it relieves the tension and independence that leads to rebellion. When you make fellowship the rule of the day, children become addicted to it. Your unreserved joy in their very existence, in their presence, in

everything they do becomes their daily manna from heaven. Children who feel your absolute good will and devotion do not want to do anything to mar that spirit of joy and communion.

When you can cultivate a state where the spirit of the child is always willing, you will still come up against the reality that the flesh is indeed weak. The world is full of competing lusts, and the body of the child grows into ever-increasing passions. So the parent is always competing for attention and relevance. The older they get, the less power we have. They must be trained and conditioned to right thinking and acting before the need of correction arises. When the flesh of the child rises up to mar the fellowship, and we discover the child is incubating a little of the devil, we must not allow the aberration in attitude to rob us of that fellowship, for our power is that communion upon which they have come to depend. The danger is that insecure, impatient parents with a dictatorial spirit may take personal offense to the child's untoward behavior and rush to crush resistance. When fellowship is broken, all that is left is constraint, intimidation, fear, and bullying.

It takes a lot of time to be an effective parent. It is a full-time job. I

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Shoshanna never puts her children aside when she is working in the home. The little ones are always sitting on the countertop when she is cooking, usually covered in flour or the like. Every dish served has been combed by little fingers. The kids are proud of meals because the two-year-old knows that she has prepared a meal for the family. All housework involves the kids. All cleanup. They love to read a book with you. When I go to the house (at least twice a day) the little one will hand me a book. She doesn't expect all the excitement of a visit to stop so we can read. It is just an automatic impulse to express fellowship. I look at the book, turn one page and say, "Wow, that is a big lizard." She grins in satisfaction and walks off with the book. She has greeted me, I have acknowledged her pleasure, and she is satisfied.

There are rare times when a



child's will is thwarted and they express displeasure with a screwed up face and maybe a trembling lip. Shoshanna never ignores such a display. All conversation stops until the child is in fellowship with the family and guests. She speaks in her "I mean business" voice, which is alarming even to me, and says something like Solomon that addresses the issue: "You know that is not yours; it is hers. So dry it up and be thankful for your sister. Give her a kiss and tell her you love her. Now give Mommy a kiss. Give Big Papa a kiss. Now give teddy a kiss. But don't kiss the cat; he is nasty." By now the little fellow has forgotten his grievance and is smiling with all the fun and humorous attention. Only once or twice have I seen one of her children act in a way that required a swat or two to get their attention and convince them she means business. Our book *To Train Up a Child* goes into more detail on disciplining children, a subject too big for this article.

You ask, "How will it work out when they are older?" Her oldest child is Jeremiah, now sixteen, and he is the most stable teen you will ever meet. His confidence level is off the charts. He is highly intelligent, a competitive conversationalist on politics and world affairs. He takes full responsibility to help raise the younger children and will no doubt make an excellent father someday if the Lord tarries. Moms, it is too early to bring your daughters around. I talked to Jeremiah about it and he says, "Wait another month."

This is a subject dear to my heart. About twenty-eight years ago we wrote the best-selling book *To Train Up a Child*. It sold well over

a million copies in English, with many additional copies in a dozen foreign languages. Tens of thousands of parents credit it with saving their children, some with saving their marriage, and a few with saving their souls. The biblical truth of it was so offensive to the leftist progressives, especially to the sodomite crowd, that they came against it with lies, even to national news outlets. We received death threats from homosexuals. But the ministry just increased many times over and continues to do so. If you are a young parent and have not read *To Train Up a Child*, you should get a copy before it becomes illegal to publish biblically based child training material. ■

### *Preface*

Unrestrained human will, sovereignly permitted, appears to have grown into a malignancy, for we fight and kill to be free only to succumb to a bondage within. Our inner captivity seems to be so thorough as to be the first principle of existence. Yet we resist our degradation like a man resists drowning, for when we fail to be good we pretend to be.

When we find ourselves unfulfilled, even miserable, we look to religion or philosophy. Diversity of philosophy testifies to our agreement that there is a problem. Diversity of religion testifies to our lack of agreement on the solution. Philosophy sits on the steps explaining the process, watching the captives march off to their cruel destiny, while religion, far from being a solution, is often leading the captives. In the end the philosopher cowers alone, harmlessly babbling his imaginations, while the priest takes the sword to make converts. So the Holy Grail is often stirred with a bloody dagger.

Historians stand over the graves of great men to record their achievements. Regardless of our pomp and glory, disease and death is the door through which we all must exit. The feeble moth and decay eventually erase all evidence of our passing.

Are we actors in a Shakespearean tragedy? Is earth a stage on which we perform a pre-written drama? It is as if we began our existence somewhere in the middle of a play and will disappear beyond the curtain long before the last act. Without a script the performance has no

meaning beyond immediate personal indulgence.

Sometimes in the midst of the pain and injustice, when it becomes obvious there is no fairness, some are prone to doubt that this “drama” has any plot. Theories of self-creation and chance have replaced belief in an intelligent Creator. Belief in an unplanned existence without destination begets meaninglessness, which begets futility, and futility begets loneliness. It has been observed, unless earth’s inhabitants are indulging they are all lonely.

Many doubt God’s good intentions, angry at the Deity whom they feel is responsible for their sufferings. While denying or at least ignoring His existence they continue to blame Him for not being more in control. Their concern is not so much with overall meaning as with their own fulfillment.

“Why did He do this to ME? If this God knows what will happen in the future, He would have known the results of His botched creation.” A baby dies... “Why did God let this happen?” An accident, and someone is left crippled or scarred... “Doesn’t God care?” War, famine, AIDS... “If I were God, I would ...,” and so it goes. Very few of earth’s inhabitants ever really trust their Creator.

Inmates in the state prisons, students on college campuses, and our neighbors next door all ask the same accusing questions. Likewise, Christian parents standing beside a small grave are often heard challenging God. If we fault others for questioning God, we should be reminded that our heart often asks questions our lips are too cautious to speak.

- “How can I believe and trust a ‘sovereign God’ who allows so much evil? Is God impotent? If not, then does He care?”
- “Why did God even make us capable of sinning? If He knows all and is all powerful, couldn’t He have created a world without sin and death?”
- “Why? Why did God create Lucifer if He knew it would result in sin?”
- “Why did God put the tree of knowledge of good and evil in the garden if He did not want Adam and Eve to sin?”
- “If I could help it, I would not allow my children to be subject to pain and suffering. Why would the Creator let souls live forever in Hell? Why would He not just destroy them so they would not continue to suffer?”
- “Couldn’t an all-wise God develop a plan that didn’t involve suffering for so many?”

Theologians often dismiss these questions by answering, “God didn’t create sin, Satan did,” or saying, “God doesn’t send men to Hell, they send themselves by their sin.” Why do these answers not satisfy our deepest sense of the rational?

## From chapter 11 - *Parable of the king's son*

In a faraway land and in another time, a benevolent king ruled his kingdom wisely, and all the people loved him. Well, not all. There was a small group of rebels who worked in secret, seeking to overthrow his rule. They wanted the freedom to engage in immoral revelry, which was not permitted under this righteous king. The usual punishment for treason was death, but the king passed a law saying that anyone guilty of treason would be allowed to live but would have his eyes put out. On several occasions young men were brought before the king to be tried for treason. After carefully hearing the evidence the king had regretfully pronounced the penalty of blindness upon some of these young men.

One day the king's sheriff brought a young man before the court to be tried for treason. It was rumored that he was the ringleader of the rebellion. The king was disturbed by the hood covering the upper body of the prisoner. But the court lawyers requested that the concealment remain in place to assure that justice would be accomplished. The king went along with the request, assuming that the accused must be an acquaintance or perhaps the son of some state official. He had heard the evidence that proved to be overwhelmingly incriminating. When it came time to pass sentence the lawyers removed the hood to reveal the king's own son. The king was about to pass the sentence of blindness on his only son. With great restraint of his emotions he announced that he would wait twenty-four hours to pronounce the judgment. Though it could not make a difference in the court's decision, the king used that time, to no avail, trying to bring his son to repentance. The son felt sure that the father could not forgive him, and the penalty of the law was unavoidable.

During the intervening time, word of the developing situation spread over all the kingdom. There was much speculation about what the king would do. Half of the people characterized the king as a man who placed duty and the letter of the law above his own feelings. They supposed the king would not only take out his son's eyes but also have him executed as an example. The other half of the kingdom believed the king would yield to deep feelings toward his son and free him unharmed. Many believed that he would elicit from the son a promise of allegiance and then set aside the penalty of the law.

The king found himself in a dilemma, with two conflicting compulsions. He desired to save his son, and he desired to remain a just and lawful king. Having blinded others for the same offense, could he make an exception with his son and still maintain the public perception of just? How could the public continue to respect his rule? Furthermore, if he should withhold the punishment, how could he command respect or control of his son? The offense would forever stand between the king and his son. If not punished, would the rebellious son not be even bolder in his rebellion?

On the other hand, how could he pass sentence on his own son? Could a father who begat a son of his own body, and invested so much in rearing him, suddenly shut off all feelings? Could he just blind his son and forget? Would life have any further meaning for a father?

Twenty-four hours later the court was reconvened. The royal city was packed with expectant, solemn onlookers. The prisoner was brought into the court. His face not being covered, his bitterness was clear for all to see. Looking at his countenance, one would think he was holding his father responsible for his rebellion.

The king was the last to enter the chamber. With expectancy running high, he was led into the chamber wearing the hood his son wore the day before. Feebly, he was steered to his place on the throne. He immediately commenced to recount the incriminating evidence. Then while the crowd stood in hushed wonder, just when he was preparing to pass sentence he reached up and slipped the hood from his head. The audience fell back in revulsion as they saw the two gaping, bloody holes where royal eyes had once been. The crowd gasped as the king addressed the general public. A servant placed before the people a tray containing the king's eyes. The king asked the general public if common justice could be served by the substitution of his eyes for his son's. The people unanimously agreed that justice was served. The king had found a way to be faithful to his law, thereby maintaining its integrity, and a way to satisfy his love to his son.

One problem remained, the son's rebellion. If the father had been able to elicit prior repentance from the son, the sacrifice would have seemed justifiable. But the offering was made when the son was still a self-proclaimed enemy of the king. That too was resolved in the king's bloody sacrifice. Seeing the father's love and forgiveness, the son was moved to repent toward his father. All doubt as to the father's love and wisdom involuntarily vanished. The son fell at his father's feet and begged for the forgiveness that he had already received. He was placed at the father's right hand where he forever thereafter faithfully and benevolently assisted in all affairs of the kingdom.

The dilemma was solved. Sacrificing neither his love to his son nor justice, the law had been honored in a way that elevated it as never before. The king had not only expressed his love to his son, but had brought him to humble repentance. The integrity of the kingdom was maintained and the son was saved—all at the father's expense. "That he might be just and the justifier... For God so loved the world that he gave..." ■

Recently, a friend came to me seeking some counsel regarding another person. I smiled at her frustration with this person because I, too, had some negative feelings toward this person. At first, while she told me of what this other person was doing, I thought “how awful! I knew something seemed off.” I started to jump on the bandwagon with her, placing my justified judgment upon this other person.

But before I got too far, I felt a nudge in my spirit to be careful. I knew this was my friend and I wanted to take her side. I knew I had negative feelings already toward the other person and that could cloud the counsel I gave her.

I wanted to be a wise friend—one who actually helped my friend be a better person. I wanted to be able to put my feelings aside and give wise counsel based on truth, not friendship or my personal feelings.

So I took a step back and did several things before speaking to her again on the matter.

I prayed. I asked God for wisdom to help me actually be a good friend, put my own feelings aside, and give counsel based on truth, his Word. I asked for understanding and discernment.

I sought wise counsel from my husband and one other friend on the matter. It’s important to me to seek counsel from others who are not swayed by emotions or friendships, but who will give me the truth even if it’s not what I want to hear. Those people are rare.

I gave it a little time so I could think, pray, seek counsel, and also find a way to talk to her that she could understand and really hear what I was saying.

Meanwhile, my husband and I had been having an ongoing conversation about giving counsel and

getting involved in situations that don't belong to us. So I asked him, "What is the proper response to situations that arise between close friends, family, church members, or in general people around you?"

I love his advice:

*If there is a dispute between two people that doesn't belong to you, then it's not for you to get involved in the first place—on either side. As it says in Proverbs 26:17, "He that passeth by, and meddleth with strife belonging not to him, is like one that taketh a dog by the ears."*

*It isn't for you to go in and give them advice or judgment. If you're not a part of the situation, you don't know all the details, so your judgment won't be accurate or just.*


*If both parties were to come to you together and say, "Hey, we have this dispute and we both trust you to have the wisdom to be the judge over this matter," that would be different. Then you would hear both sides of the matter from both parties. Doing so gives you a more complete understanding and a better, more just judgment over the matter.*

*If only one side comes to you, you cannot accurately judge the situation with wisdom, truth, and justice. The only thing you can do if one party comes to you is advise them on their own attitude and actions.*

*If you have not been made judge by BOTH parties, you cannot fully give just judgment.*

*It can be hard to stick to that because that's usually not what the one party coming to you is looking for. They're often seeking affirmation of the judgment they've already made. They want you to join them in their condemnation of the other person. And it's easy to do that, because it feels good in the moment; your sense of justice will seem to demand it. But the other party isn't seeking your counsel, so pronouncing judgment on both parties is fruitless—or it will bear the sour and rotting fruit of bitterness and self-righteousness in both you and the one coming to you for counsel. Wisdom is mindful that you aren't in a position to change the other person, but you CAN help challenge the person coming to you to walk in truth and love.*

I loved this! He made it so simple. It's easy to want to jump in and give advice or judge a situation, but I have to remember if it's not mine, I will never fully know the matter or be able to give just or wise counsel. If I haven't been made the judge over the matter by both parties, my duty is to literally mind my own business—to not take the dog by the ears, unless I want to get bitten. ■

Mike was briefly a Boy Scout some 68 years ago. The other day he was quoting (or trying to) something he had learned back then: “Prepare to succeed or you will have prepared to fail.” This statement must have resonated with him for him to remember it. It reminded me of the statement that I based my children’s *Yell and Tell* books on: “Those prepared are usually spared.” I came up with the phrase after reading about a thousand testimonies of children, teens, and adults who were almost victims of abuse but escaped due to someone’s simple words warning them of what could happen and how to respond. As I read the testimonies I was struck by what many parents have said: “I don’t want my child to have to think of something that awful happening to them, so I wouldn’t read the *Yell and Tell* books to them. It would be stealing their innocence.” The actual testimonies of would-be victims were the exact

opposite. The preparation didn’t make the children fearful, but rather it gave them courage to know they could control any situation. Parents who don’t prepare their children are mostly motivated by their own sense of inadequacy in addressing the subject. The takeaway is this: preppers are not fearful; non-preppers are.

Everyone is preparing for the future. Some prepare to overcome and conquer; all others, through neglect, are preparing to fail. Everyone who has any sense at all NEEDS to give some serious thought to preparing for coming LIKELY difficult times. In our lifetime there have been many occasions when folks were yelling “wolf” and it was possible that the wolves were circling, but then again it was also likely they weren’t. We have always been the type to be prepared. For me, it was mostly just because it was stimulating and fun.

Be advised: the fun is over. Now the wolves are circling.

All good Boy Scouts know that you can't depend on someone else to take care of you, because for every well-prepared Boy Scout there are going to be a thousand—maybe ten thousand—folks expecting someone else to take them in. This could stretch those who are equipped mighty thin and most people who have done their preparation are not going to appreciate slackers expecting a handout.

So, take some advice from an old Scout: Get the family to a safe place: not someone else's safe place, your own place. Don't just plan on buying food, buy today. Not five boxes of Hostess Twinkies, nor Army rations; get dried beans, canned meat, peanut butter, and other such stuff

that will last. If you are short on money, then stop ALL eating out or snack buying at the gas station because you feel faint. Quit your coffee stops and don't buy that new sweater you "need." Instead, use that money for preparing. It is amazing how money dribbles out on nonsense things. A little sobriety will help you see that soon and very soon money will not be the only scarce thing.

Just do it!

If you will need it tomorrow, next month, and a year from now, then get it today because "those prepared are usually spared." Not always, but you will at least have peace of mind that you have done the right thing for your family. ■
