I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth. 3 John 4

We were born just after World War II. The horror was still very fresh. The Korean War came when we were kids, then the Vietnam War took the lives of our high school classmates. We were in Memphis ministering when Dr. King was killed and the rioting began. We watched on TV when the demonstrating college kids were shot down at Kent State. We were old when everyone freaked out about Y2K. None of those events seemed like they were the end times.



Adoption

is a redemption story

Adoption is a redemption story. It is a reflection of our own adoption into God's family. When we can relate with our adopted children regarding our own adoption in Christ, we come to better understand what God desires for us as his adopted children. He wants us to feel safe and secure in his provision and care; he wants us to come boldly to his throne of grace; he wants us to know how much he loves us. It is his

very goodness that leads us to repentance and a deeper relationship and walk with him. And it is this goodness that will also lead your adopted child toward healing, redemption, and a closer, healthier relationship with you as their parent.

I am the mother of three now-adult children, all adopted from Vietnam. Our oldest was five months old when my husband and I arrived home with

him. Three years later, we adopted a seven-month-old and a five-month-old together. We were so excited to start a family! We believed that since we had adopted our children at such young ages, we could raise them normally without any adoptive issues. We spent the next several years learning just how mistaken we were.

Adoption issues are very real and need to be addressed practically. Unfortunately, there was little in the way of information and resources available to us at the time. People's advice from their experiences with their birth children did

not work with my children but left me feeling like a colossal parental failure. I spent many nights in tears beside my bed crying out to God in desperation. I learned to follow the Holy Spirit's leading in parenting. Between that, the Pearls' teachings, and a lot of grace, my children are the amazing young adults they are today.

Every adopted child has a story. Every adopted child has a past. Every adopted child has unique needs. Like a baby announcement, when adoption is announced, it is cause for celebration, baby showers, and well-wishes to the new parents. However, that's often where the similarities end, as many adoptive parents find themselves in circumstances they were not fully prepared for. While the idea of adoption can feel warm and fuzzy, the reality of parenting adopted children is a different ballgame. Though I have no birth children, I grew up a birth child, and I have spoken with many mothers

who have had both birth children and adopted children. Many "normals" do not apply, leaving adoptive parents in situations where they have little point of reference.

These differences can become greater when dealing with international adoptions and cultural differences. They are also greater when dealing with older adopted children. One family I know

raised beautiful children of their own. As their kids were grown and leaving the nest, they reached out and adopted a sibling group. The following years of parenting were nothing like their earlier experience

with their own children. There were many more difficulties, and if one did not know they had already successfully raised a family, a passerby might assume something was very wrong with their parenting. The entire community learned a valuable lesson and is now able to be much more supportive of other adoptive families in the area.


Children are conceived as a life-book with blank pages. As early as their months in the womb, their mother begins to have influence over them and begins to write in their books. Debi Pearl explains more about this in her book, *Create a Better Brain through Neuroplasticity: A Manual for Mamas*. As a birth parent, you are in control from the beginning of what's being written on your child's heart, and you know your child's history. With adoptive children, you often have no idea what transpired during the mothers' pregnancy, how the birthing went, or what their first months or years were filled

with. What you can know for certain are a few other things.

One-hundred percent of the time, adopted children experience rejection, abandonment, failure, and trauma inherent with the loss of their birth mother. Then there is often additional trauma, abuse, or neglect of some kind. If the adoption is international, there is a whole new culture, language, and race to adapt to. Adopted children are wounded in many ways by the time they arrive in their new home. As babies, their wounds may not be as obvious, but as they get older, the unresolved trauma becomes more noticeable. The personality of each child determines how they react to these early life changes and

events, which affect them in no small ways. Your own responses to their reactions, as well as the environment you foster in your home, play a large role in their ability to process through these events toward a healthy outlook on life. And process they must.



Things are not always as they seem with adoptive children. Sometimes things can seem smooth for a while, but until they process and heal from their losses, the wounds remain dormant until something triggers them.

Holding knowledge and understanding about adopted children's needs will help encourage and instruct you during times of difficulty when you hit a rough patch. Understanding the common challenges that come with every adoption will help you be more prepared and can give you more compassion and wisdom along the way.

Though adopted children are in great need of love and healing, it is often the last thing they will readily accept. Instead, they often bite the hand trying to help them. They resist attempts to connect. They play on emotions and take advantage of what is given rather than allow the flow of love and acceptance being offered. They reject because they were rejected. They do not trust because they were abandoned.

They expect you to fail them because others before you did so. They are familiar with trauma and seem to attract it. They believe they must protect themselves because no one protected them when they needed it most. They may follow in cycles of self-neglect or abuse, reliving their past. Or they can become abusers themselves, raining down their anger and pain onto others.

This can sound like a miserable endeavor without much hope. But it is just the opposite! There is much hope because we have a Redeemer, Healer, Great Physician, and Father who has a special place in his heart for these children. With him, there is hope. He turns the hearts of kings, and he heals the hearts of broken children.

What he needs are adoptive parents to love on his orphans unconditionally, to demonstrate the same kind of love that he shows us. We must first be filled with his love so that we can give fully and completely like he does. The adoptive parent is called to be a

conduit of God's love, pouring love like honey into a bucket filled with cracks and holes, reflecting Jesus until he can draw them to himself for their ultimate healing.

This can seem a daunting task that you've been entrusted with. However, if you have adopted, God has chosen you to be his hands, heart, and lips to speak truth over them and minister to them. This takes his strength, wisdom, and discernment to accomplish, but God is faithful to provide everything you need. God is using you to bring healing to them and change the trajectory of their lives. He saved these children out of the enemy's snare for intended destruction, and you now stand in the gap for their lives.

This is your most powerful weapon, as your enemy is not flesh and blood. The devil fights to remain in control of your child's life. You are his biggest threat, so he tries to use the child against you, your home, your marriage, and your family. But God is greater. He is faithful to provide you with the mercy, strength, and wisdom you need each day. Things may not always look like you think they should. Let Jesus lead and trust the outcome to him.

We are shepherding our children toward the Good Shepherd. And as our own Shepherd, He will guide us along the way. He offers direction and instruction for parenting under the

guidance of the Spirit and in his Word. Parenting adopted children is not a happily-ever-after story but a mission field. Even after countless crises, collapses, and catastrophes, God can do above and beyond what you can possibly think or imagine. It is his nature to redeem, restore, renew, and repay where the enemy has stolen, and he will do just that. Be encouraged! He did it for me, and he'll do it for you.

Each of my children experienced a lot of trauma and loss that affected both them and our whole family for years. God faithfully provided for needs that I didn't even know existed until much later. Each of my children has a story to tell. I am now an "empty nester" as all three are off pursuing their dreams in work, college, and ministry. They are intelligent, productive adults and I could brag all day on them and the challenges and hurdles they have faced, dealt with, and overcome and are continuing to grow in. I am profoundly thankful to be their mother, and grateful to God for his faithfulness to us through the years. I can't wait to continue watching how God uses them for his purposes and to his glory. This has been his story, and I have been privileged to be a part of it.

Learning to **train** not to **parent**

Twenty-one years ago, my husband and I adopted our first child. At the time, we were not the typical adoption family. Many couples go through a lengthy period of trying to have children before grieving the loss of hope and turning toward the option of adoption. Because of a trauma in my husband's early childhood, we knew before we were married that adoption was our course of action for a family. We went through pre-adoption classes and decided to adopt from Vietnam. The adoption process took nine months. We came home Christmas Eve with a beautiful five-month-old baby boy.

Overall James was a happy, easy-going toddler. He was adorable and won over everybody he came in contact with. I loved being a mother. James

made it seem easy for the first year. I felt confident in my parenting skills since I had helped care for my four younger siblings while growing up. It wasn't long, however, before I became aware that being an older sister is not the same as being a parent. As James approached two years old, I began to believe in the "terrible twos" and realized I needed help. I reached out to older ladies at church and asked lots of questions about how they had parented.

A friend heard I was searching and gave me a book from an author I'd never heard of. It was called *To Train Up a Child*. I read and reread the book. The idea of child training versus teaching was new to me but made a lot of sense. I hadn't realized the difference before. I started experimenting with some of the training concepts and was surprised. They worked better than I

thought possible. I saw that No Greater Joy also offered videos of conferences where they taught on biblical child training. I ordered them, and my son and I would sit on the couch and watch them together.

I began to realize that I was the one who needed training first. It was my job as a parent to watch over my word and keep it. I began to look for ways to train. As I practiced this new skill, James would grin because he knew what was coming; we were training. It was like a game to him, and we had a lot of fun with it. “Run to the bathroom, bring me a piece of toilet paper, then go and place it on the kitchen table.” It really didn’t matter what I said, since it was his obedience to my word that we were practicing.

Of course, training has an end purpose: to prepare. It was also my duty to recognize and identify skills my son would need and to train him in preparation ahead of time. One night as I was cleaning off the table after supper, it occurred to me that eventually I would want James to be able to clear his own dishes himself. I also felt quite certain that, later on down the road, his wife would be thankful for a husband who cleaned up after himself in the kitchen. I handed his plate to him and asked, “Are you able to reach and put your plate up here on the counter?” It took some effort on tiptoes, but he managed it and was quite proud of himself for doing so. I complimented him and tucked away the information for the following day.

After eating breakfast, we said a prayer like we always did before getting up from the table. This time, however, I showed him how to take his plate and silverware over to the counter. I praised him and then promptly brought the place setting back to the table. “Let’s

try that again!” We sat down, prayed, and I again helped guide him through taking his plate to the counter. I wanted to connect the known (our prayer) with the new (picking up his plate). We cycled through this a few times for breakfast and then for lunch. By supper, I bragged to my husband, “James learned something new today! He’ll show you after we pray.” With a big grin and an air of importance, James climbed down from his stool, gathered up his plate, and successfully planted it on the counter. Within a week, James needed no supervision from me at all. He is now taller than me and still taking his dishes to the sink and soaking them.

I was no longer facing the “terrible twos” but was enjoying the “terrific twos.” James and I did a lot together and had so much fun and sweet

fellowship while training. When something needed to be addressed, it was no longer a long, drawn-out battle but was dealt with quickly with a hug and a prayer following, restoring fellowship immediately afterwards. Sometimes, James would come and confess something he'd done and ask for a spanking. Afterwards, he'd cuddle in my arms and thank me.

I had no idea such fellowship existed and marveled at the change in my son from the intentional acts of training. I had been raised with an overbearing rod of punishment. As a result, I wanted nothing to do with the rod and was trying to parent without it. Through Michael and Debi's teachings, I learned that the rod is an effective tool when applied correctly after proper training and within the scope of fellowship. It should never, never be applied while the parent is angry or as a substitute for training. This breeds resentful anger and further breaks down fellowship. We continued to train,

from getting dressed in the morning, to learning manners, to conducting himself in respectful habits out in public. Older people loved to see a toddler who would speak to them without being shy, and James drew smiles from everyone as he'd respond with a smile, "Yes, please" or "No, thank you." He got along well with other kids, both his age and those who were older or younger than he.

I loved James's heart of obedience. It blessed my soul to watch him walk in wisdom at such a young age. He wanted to please me, and he loved receiving my praise for his good behavior. Proverbs 16:21 says, "The wise in heart shall be called prudent: and the sweetness of the lips increaseth learning." I loved the sweet fellowship we walked in, and was especially thankful for the fact that it was not a put-on show while out in public but flowed from our home life.

From this new basis, I began to have James help out with things long before

are not perfect, nor are they saints. Dads and moms make mistakes all the time. How you handle these situations will be an important life lesson for your children.

he was actually able to be very useful. I took Michael Pearl at his word that it was an investment that would later pay in dividends. James began “helping” me with sweeping, dishes, laundry, dusting, cooking, baking, gardening, weeding, yard work, creative projects, and odd jobs. Everything took me longer at first, as I’d explain, demonstrate, and teach as I went. Not only did James learn new things and the time spent together strengthened our daily ties of fellowship, but he was also gaining new skills and forming healthy habits while these things were considered fun, new, and novel to him.

He was preparing to be a very helpful older brother, and Michael was right: the investment paid off. There were several years of investment, followed by several years of his holding his own. Now, I am benefiting from the investment as he comes home from college and helps around the house, lightening my load as I have returned to school as a full-time student myself. Another benefit is knowing that my investment will go on to bless his wife one day. I often asked the question as I worked with him: what

might his wife appreciate some day? What might his family appreciate from him? The more I could sow into him in the younger years, the more habitual it would be for him. “Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it,” (Proverbs 22:6).

I’m thankful for the book that landed in my lap when I needed it most. I put it to the test and its biblical truth and wisdom proved its worth. It helped prepare me for the next addition to our family through adoption, when my husband and I suddenly found ourselves outnumbered three to two, with three children under the age of three.



It is easy to recognize when a child has had significant interaction with his parents. His eyes are bright and alive with the pleasure of everything happening around him.

He is always “in the way,” not wanting to be left out of anything interesting—and everything is interesting! He is full of meaningful questions and expects an intelligent answer. On the other hand, children who have been raised by cartoons and computer games and are relegated to the out-of-the-way back bedrooms filled with toys and music are dull and unresponsive. They lack interest and generally seem to have a lower IQ than children of interactive parents. The on-his-own child is full of embarrassing, silly nonsense or is seen to have a dull, disinterested stare. It is a sad state seen in most children today.

It has been proven that the blue screen alters the brain of children (Read *Create a Better Brain Through Neuroplasticity: A Manual for Mamas*). We can create in our children amazing brains, but we must care enough to sacrifice our time and energies to stay engaged.

When a very young child is constantly interacting with his parents, it is readily apparent that his understanding exceeds that of his screen-viewing peers.

We have been in the ministry for over 60 years, and during all that time we have had the opportunity to observe several generations growing up. We have clearly seen that children who have been raised in an atmosphere where they are challenged to use their minds and their voices will more likely grow up to become independent thinkers.



Children who have been talked with (not to), intellectually stimulated, challenged to understand, and have things explained to them before they were “old enough” to understand will understand long before their peers. A parent’s goal should be to provoke their children to be wise and creative, to be aggressive in their desire to learn, and to be actively engaged in life.

God has dedicated an entire book of the Bible to this subject. The book of Proverbs teaches us to seek wisdom. HOW do you seek wisdom? You start by gaining knowledge and as your knowledge grows, you understand human nature and motivations, and you come to understand the causes and effects of life choices. As a person sees reality, his respect and appreciation for God grows, as does his fear of walking afoul of the path of righteousness. God says over and over, “The fear of God is the beginning of wisdom.” Proverbs 2:6 says, “For the LORD giveth wisdom: out of his mouth cometh knowledge

and understanding.” Children are not born with knowledge, understanding, or wisdom. Sadly, most folks will go to their graves never coming to a wise state because few people really ever fear God. As parents, our job is to start our children on the path of knowledge and understanding and to teach them the fear of God. God uses his stories that are found in the Old Testament to help us gain this natural respect for the eternal Father.

A child's first understanding of rules of life comes through interaction with those they love and trust. Children who are blessed with the respect of the adults in their life become so engaged that they often have to be told to wait before sharing their well-respected opinion.

They expect you to want to know what is on their mind, just as they want to know what is on yours. If you are sewing, they want to try their hand at it. If you are cooking, they want to smell the food, taste the mix, and stir everything. When you are loading firewood or cleaning out an old sewer pipe, they want to be there right smack in the way, holding something for you so as to feel a part of the project.



The child who is encouraged to interact socially and in projects will not be a slobbering, screen-headed fool. He

will be marked with bubbling self-confidence and self-respect. The set-aside child is the one who becomes self-loathing, knowing for certain that he is pushed away because he is clearly worthless. The lack of understanding causes insecurity. The interactive kid will be confident and grow up to be a shaker and mover of people and events.

Children engaged in meaningful conversation throughout the day grow up to speak so that others listen. And they grow up to listen carefully so as to understand the subtle nuances of what is being said. A good vocabulary doesn't come from books; it comes more from conversation.

Time spent at the table talking is more important than times tables. God said it like this in Isaiah 28:9–10: **“Whom shall he teach knowledge? and whom shall he make to understand doctrine? them that are weaned from the milk, and drawn from the breasts. For precept must be upon precept, precept upon precept; line upon line, line upon line; here a little, and there a little.”** Here a little and there a little—even while they are nursing. Don't let ignorance get ahold of their young minds, and don't let the status quo become their default ambition.

Let's face it, Mama. We mothers are responsible for the greatest part of our children's education and development. Become more than their loving babysitter. It is common for fathers to leave the raising of young children to Mother and not get very involved in their sons'

lives until they are old enough to tag along and participate in their adult work and play, but it is then that Dad discovers his son is a lazy mama's boy, an insecure, disinterested sissy.

Wonder why Dad can't relate to his son? Mother, engage your son so that when your husband does try to relate, he finds him interesting and challenging. Your son should be snappy and quick-witted, interested in all that is happening, eager to try everything, full of curiosity and a zest for new experiences. If your son is going to be able to ask an intelligent question, he will have to have a genuine interest in what his dad is doing. Your attitude and conversation can generate that interest in your son.

Encourage your children to speak of their ideas, recount their dreams, explain what they mean, and defend their position with logic. We regularly told our children Bible stories and discussed the whys and hows of them. The Bible says, **"My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge: because thou hast rejected knowledge, I will also reject thee, that thou shalt be no priest to me: seeing thou hast forgotten the law of thy God, I will also forget thy children"** (Hosea 4:6).

Bible knowledge is armor to the wearer thereof. It is wisdom. It is

freedom. Read and tell your Bible stories until all your children can recite them back to the family with exciting zeal. You will also discover that it is an excellent way to teach them to speak in public with confidence.

Life is always about interaction. **"For none of us liveth to himself, and no man dieth to himself"** (Romans 14:7). Give your children the gift of a vision of who and what they can be. You don't have to be highly educated to accomplish this, just highly motivated. Talk and laugh with your children. Listen to them, ask questions, wait for the answers, respect their opinions, and share your ideas. Don't be surprised when they soon pass you up in their insatiable quest for knowledge. Praise God when you see it happening. And as they obtain knowledge, teach them to claim the promises of God. **"If any of you lack wisdom, let him ask of God, that giveth to all men liberally, and upbraideth not; and it shall be given him"** (James 1:5). Pray faithfully that God will grant them wisdom to match their acquired knowledge. And then rejoice with that growing number of faithful parents who, when finished with their child-rearing days, will be able to proclaim in God's presence, **"I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth"** (3 John 4).

Birthday presents are frivolous, passing fancies.” So fortunately, they had also given him a \$15 inflatable, air-powered rocket from Costco. Now that was a birthday gift, the kind of thing that after the

second launch the wind changes and it gets stuck in a tree. Oh well, it lasted most of his birthday. Nothing to get upset about.

But tools are a different matter. For two days Lincoln has scavenged the property, locating any tool that was left lying around. He even found several that had been lost in the grass or discarded because they were broken. The next day Lincoln was hovering over his toolbox, managing his horde of scrounged implements, when I walked up to talk to his daddy. Dad looked down and saw the little mechanic rearranging an old, rusty window glass scraper he had found that contained a razor blade at the end.

Dad immediately bent down and snatched up the tool, saying, “You can’t have that; it’s dangerous.” Always (at least until then) compliant Lincoln said, “No, it’s mine.” Dad responded

with a dismissive final word: “Its sharp on the end and it could cut you bad.”

Lincoln spoke as if an equal, “No, it’s mine.”

“Not this; you might get hurt.”

Reaching and looking offended while sounding distressed, Lincoln again said, “No, it is mine.”

He had found it where it had been thrown away, so he felt entitled to it. Tools are sacred things; you don’t mess with a man’s tools.

I have seen Lincoln whine or have a face of displeasure only two or three times, so I was surprised at his hurt defiance. What would Dad do? Moments like this are the big deals, the situations where you train them to yield to authority while keeping their hearts. It was a dangerous moment when James, Lincoln’s dad, could have planted a seed of resentment that would form the grain of sand to which other offences would attach themselves and grow a rock-hard heart beneath the surface until one day his parents say, “What got into that boy? We raised him right; why is he so angry? He acts like we are the enemy. Where did this bitterness come from?”

Lincoln and his toolbox



I am proud of all my sons and daughters. They are exemplary in their child training, producing the most amazingly stable, happy kids. So I was gratified to see how James handled the crisis. Most parents would just walk off with the tool and dismiss the child’s protest as unworthy of attention, but James was sensitive to the moment. He stopped talking to me—stopped the rotation of the world for just a moment—and squatted in front of his offended son sporting a frowny face. As he tried to explain, Lincoln kept his eye on the tool waving around in James’s hand. James sensed something which led him to make a brilliant move.

He laid the tool down on the floor between them as if to suggest it was up

for negotiation while they carried on a conversation. Lincoln immediately relaxed and looked into his father's eyes instead of at the tool, which was no longer in danger of being unjustly snatched away.
